A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. As a result of implementing the weighted 2 student formula required by Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, 3 as amended by Act 221, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, a number of programs with line item budget appropriations are included in 4 5 the weighted funds available for principals and school community councils to budget and expend. The school-level minor repairs 6 7 and maintenance accounts constitute one such program. 8 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to clarify that the account established for the school-level minor repairs and 9 10 maintenance program is no longer funded by general funds. 11 SECTION 2. Section 302A-1504, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 12 "§302A-1504 School-level minor [repairs] repair and
