A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that with the enactment 1 of Act 2, Session Laws of Hawaii 2002, two existing public 2 schools in high need communities have converted to new century 3 conversion charter schools. The transitions of these schools to 4 new century conversion charter schools have brought additional 5 financial resources, increased accountability, and improved 6 student achievement. It has increased community and family 7 involvement in school community activities to promote student 8 9 learning. As the legislature increases its financial support to our 10 educational system, the nonprofit organizations for the new 11 century conversion charter schools will be faced with a greater 12

burden to match a minimum contribution of \$1 per pupil toward 13 the operation of the new century conversion charter school for 14 every \$4 per pupil allocated by the department of education. 15

is not the intent of the legislature to discourage the nonprofit 16

organizations from supporting our educational system with 17

additional financial resources. 18

1 The minimum contribution of nonprofit organizations will create a greater burden to them as the legislature increases its 2 support of our educational system. Because of this, nonprofit 3 organizations may be reluctant to support the creation of 4 additional new century conversion charter schools without 5 knowing what financial burdens they will face as the legislature 6 increases its funding level. 7 The purpose of this Act is to set forth a financial limit 8 on the total maximum contribution per pupil that the nonprofit 9 organization will be required to contribute in advance, should 10 they decide to undertake the creation of a new century 11 conversion charter school. 12 SECTION 2. Section 302A-1191, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 14 "(a) As used in this section: 15 "New century conversion charter school" means: 16 Any existing department school that converts to a 17 (1)charter school and is managed and operated in 18 accordance with subsection (d); or 19 Any existing department school that converts to a (2) 20 charter school and is managed and operated by a 21
