A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DENTISTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a severe 1
- 2 shortage of dental services in the underserved communities of
- Hawaii, particularly with Med-QUEST and uninsured patients. 3
- This growing crisis is due to geographic isolation, lack of 4
- educational opportunities for dentists and their families, and 5
- salaries that are up to twenty per cent lower than on the
- 7 mainland.
- The legislature further finds that dental health is 8
- paramount in the overall health and wellbeing of the citizens of 9
- Hawaii and that an incentive program needs to be established to 10
- maximize the availability of quality dental care in the 11
- 12 underserved communities. The dental care student loan repayment
- 13 program will advance this purpose by enabling dentists who are
- already licensed and experienced to fill the immediate need 14
- while alleviating the huge financial burden that professional 15
- 16 education imposes on dentists.
- 17 The purpose of this Act is to establish a student loan
- repayment program as an incentive for dentists who serve in the 18



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1	underserved communities and accept Med-QUEST and uninsured
2	patients.
3	SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
5	and to read as follows:
6	"S321- Dental care student loan repayment program;
7	establishment. (a) There is established within the department
8	of health a dental care student loan repayment program to be
9	administered by the director of health. The program shall
10	provide student loan repayment to dentists in exchange for
11	service in an underserved community in Hawaii as provided for in
12	subsection (b).
13	(b) Pursuant to this program, the department shall award a
14	dentist one year of educational loan repayment annually in
15	exchange for each year that the dentist agrees to practice in a
16	state-designated dental health professional shortage area;
17	provided that the dental professional:
18	(1) Is licensed to practice dentistry under chapter 448;
19	and
20	(2) Meets at least one of the following criteria:
21	(A) The dental professional is employed by a
22	federally qualified health center; or

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1		(B) The dental professional owns or is employed by a
2		practice that is open to new clients enrolled in
3		the Med-QUEST program and offers dental services
4		to the uninsured on a sliding fee scale or on a
5		pro bono basis.
6	(c)	There shall be established a special account within
7	the state	treasury to be expended by the department of health
8	for the p	urposes of the dental care student loan repayment
9	program.	
10	<u>(d)</u>	The department of health shall adopt rules in
11	accordanc	e with chapter 91 to effectuate the purpose of this
12	section.	The rules shall address the following:
13	(1)	Qualifications of applicants;
14	(2)	Application procedures;
15	(3)	The amount of student loan repayment available each
16		year;
17	(4)	Criteria for fulfilling an applicant's obligation for
18		providing dental care in exchange for student loan
19		repayment;
20	(5)	The limitation, suspension, or revocation of
21		repayments; and

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1	(6) Sanctions for a violation of this section or any rule
2	adopted pursuant to this section."
3	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so
5	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, to
6	be deposited into the special account established under section
7	2 of this Act, for the purposes of this Act.
8	SECTION 4. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
9	department of health for the purposes of this Act.
10	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
