A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE PROCEEDINGS ON THE INTERNET.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it is crucial to the 2 decision-making of the legislature to have citizen involvement 3 and input into the legislative process and that one of the most 4 effective means of promoting this is through public access. 5 legislature has demonstrated its commitment to the principle of 6 public access to the legislative process by creating programs 7 such as the public access room, the legislative broadcast 8 project, and the legislative website that encourage education 9 and support for citizen involvement in the legislative process. 10 Televised coverage of state legislative sessions and 11 hearings is an important source of information for citizen participation in public proceedings. At present, some 12 13 legislative sessions are available through the public broadcast 14 project, but those are only available to people who have access 15 to cable television and are only available at certain broadcast 16 times. One method of broadcasting legislative hearings to as 17 many people as possible is the broadcast of legislative events 18 through video and audio on the Internet.

S.B. NO. 1006

This process, called streaming media or webcasting, takes 1 audio or video signals of an event and converts them into a 2 digital file. The file is routed through computer servers for 3 4 broadcast over the Internet. With a webcasting player, software 5 that is available for free, users can see or listen to the file on their computers. This technology allows messages to be 6 broadcast on all islands and beyond, and recordings of live webcasts can be archived so that users can listen to or view a 8 file whenever they wish. These streaming media, or webcasting, 9 programs can also be made available wherever computers are made 10 available, such as in public libraries, schools, youth centers, 11 12 section centers, and other public places. This technology would increase public access at a low cost to the State. 13 In addition, the internet broadcast of legislative sessions 14 and hearings will assist citizens on Oahu who wish to testify 15 before the legislature but whose time is limited. Instead of 16 spending an entire morning at the legislature waiting for their 17 bill to be heard, citizens can follow the progression of the 18 hearing over the Internet while at home or work and can decide 19 20 when to go and testify. 21 The purpose of this Act is to further enhance public access

- 4 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so

- 8 of legislative proceedings over the Internet, including house
- 9 and senate proceedings in the house and senate chambers and
- conference rooms and the capitol auditorium. 10
- 11 SECTION 3. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
- 12 clerks of the senate and the house of representatives for the
- 13 purposes of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.

Legislative Proceedings; Webcast; Appropriation

Description:

Appropriates funds for legislative media streaming to provide audio and video streaming of legislative proceedings over the Internet.
