A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE PROCEEDINGS ON THE INTERNET.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that it is crucial to the SECTION 1. 2 decision-making of the legislature to have citizen involvement and input into the legislative process and that one of the most 3 effective means of promoting this is through public access. 4 legislature has demonstrated its commitment to the principle of 5 6 public access to the legislative process by creating programs 7 such as the public access room, the legislative broadcast project, and the legislative website that encourage education 8 9 and support for citizen involvement in the legislative process. 10 Televised coverage of state legislative sessions and hearings is an important source of information for citizen 11 12 participation in public proceedings. At present, some legislative sessions are available through the public broadcast 13 14 project, but those are only available to people who have access to cable television and are only available at certain broadcast 15 times. One method of broadcasting legislative hearings to as 16 many people as possible is the broadcast of legislative events 17 through video and audio on the Internet. 18

- 1 This process, called streaming media or webcasting, takes audio or video signals of an event and converts them into a 2 digital file. The file is routed through computer servers for 3 broadcast over the Internet. With a webcasting player, software 4 5 that is available for free, users can see or listen to the file on their computers. This technology allows messages to be 6 broadcast on all islands and beyond, and recordings of live 7 webcasts can be archived so that users can listen to or view a 8 9 file whenever they wish. These streaming media, or webcasting, programs can also be made available wherever computers are made 10 available, such as in public libraries, schools, youth centers, 11 12 section centers, and other public places. This technology would increase public access at a low cost to the State. 13 14 In addition, the indexed video and audio streams broadcast of legislative sessions and hearings will assist citizens on 15 Oahu who wish to testify before the legislature but whose time 16 17 is limited. Instead of spending an entire morning at the legislature waiting for their bill to be heard, citizens can 18 follow the progression of the hearing over the Internet while at 19 home or work and can decide when to go and testify. 20 The purpose of this Act is to further enhance public access 21 by funding legislative archived and indexed video and audio

- 5 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$42,000, or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for a
- 8 video archived and indexed stream and two archived and indexed
- 9 audio streams of legislative proceedings over the Internet,
- 10 which include broadcasts from the house and senate chambers,
- 11 house and senate conference rooms, and the capitol auditorium.
- 12 SECTION 3. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
- 13 clerks of the senate and the house of representatives for the
- 14 purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
