A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LOSS MITIGATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 2 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 3 read as follows: 4 "\$46- Loss mitigation inspection. Notwithstanding any 5 law to the contrary, each county shall train its county building inspectors to properly inspect residential dwellings and 6 7 commercial buildings for compliance with the standards and requirements under article 22 of chapter 431, relating to loss 8 9 mitigation and wind resistive devices." SECTION 2. Section 431:22-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended: 11 12 1. By amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 13 "(a) Subject to the availability of funds and the 14 standards in this article, grants for wind resistive devices 15 shall be awarded by the commissioner: 16 (1) That reimburse thirty-five per cent of costs incurred 17 for the wind resistive devices and their installation,

up to a maximum total reimbursement of [\$2,100]

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1		\$15,000 per single or multi-family residential
2		dwelling;
3	(2)	That reimburse thirty-five per cent of costs incurred
4		for the wind resistive devises and their installation
5		in a commercial building; and
6	[(2)]	(3) On a first-come, first-served basis, as
, 7		determined by the commissioner[; and
8	(3)	For a wind resistive device or devices installed in a
9		single or multi-family residential dwelling]."
10	2. 1	By amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
11	"(c)	In addition, a grant may be made to an applicant only
12	if the app	plicant:
13	(1)	Has met the descriptions, specifications, guidelines,
14		and requirements established by the commissioner for
15		the grant program;
16	(2)	Has filed a completed application form, as determined
17		solely by the commissioner, together with all
18		supporting documentation required by the commissioner;
19	(3)	Has, in the case of a building with multiple
20		dwellings, filed together completed grant applications
21		for all dwellings in the building, for installation of
22		wind resistive devices indicated in section

1		431:22-104(b)(1), (2), and (4); provided that this
2		requirement does not apply to section
3		431:22-104(b)(3);
4	(4)	Has installed a wind resistive device or devices
5		including residential safe room designs that meet the
6		standards established by the state department of
7		defense and that have been designated and approved by
8		the commissioner;
9	(5)	Has fully paid, prior to applying for the grant, the
10		cost of the wind resistive device or devices, as well
11		as the installation costs for which the grant is
12		sought. The grant shall be used to reimburse only
13		these costs or a portion thereof;
14	(6)	Has [hired an inspector, determined by the
15		commissioner to be qualified in accordance with the
16		requirements of the commissioner, who has verified in
17		writing] acquired from the manufacturer or dealer of
18		the wind resistive device or devices, a written
19		verification that the installation of the wind
20		resistive device or devices is complete and is in
21		compliance with the grant program specifications,
22		guidelines, and requirements, as determined by the

1		commissioner[+], or has had the installation of the
2		wind resistive device or devices inspected by a county
3		building inspector;
4	(7)	Has installed the wind resistive device or devices
5		after July 1, 2002;
6	(8)	Has provided any other information deemed necessary by
7		the commissioner; and
8	(9)	Has met all additional requirements needed to
9		implement the grant program as determined by the
10		commissioner."
