## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as The Hawaii 2 Innovations Fund Act. SECTION 2. Chapter 304, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 4 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 5 "§304- The Hawaii innovations fund. (a) There shall 6 be established in the state treasury a fund to be known as the 7 Hawaii innovations fund that shall be administratively attached 8 9 to the university. The objective of the Hawaii innovations fund shall be 10 (b) 11 to: Stimulate economic development in life sciences and 12 (1)advanced technology using the resources of the 13 University of Hawaii, including the John A. Burns 14 School of Medicine in Kakaako; 15 (2) Create high-quality, high-income job opportunities in 16 the life sciences and advanced technology fields, 17

- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 12 budget and finance for the purposes of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii
- 14 innovations fund the sum of \$100,000,000 or so much thereof as
- 15 may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007 to be used for the
- 16 purposes of this Act.
- 17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 18 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 19 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general fund
- 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000 or so much
- 21 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007 as a

- 1 grant-in-aid to the Life Sciences Council to provide
- 2 administrative support for the Hawaii innovations fund.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 4 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 7 provided that:
- 8 (1) Sections 3, 4, and 5 shall take effect on July 1,
- 9 2006; and
- 10 (2) This Act shall be repealed on June 30, 2012, and all
- 11 unencumbered and unexpended balances remaining in the
- Hawaii innovations fund shall be transferred to the
- credit of the general fund.
