A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE MUSEUM OF HAWAIIAN MUSIC AND DANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the economic
 viability of Hawaii's tourism is heavily dependent upon the
 Hawaiian culture. The culture of the indigenous people is
 unique and of critical importance in differentiating Hawaii from
- 5 other visitor destinations. Tourism promotions, particularly
- 6 through media such as music and dance, have relied upon Hawaiian
- 7 culture as the number one marketing tool and as the foundation
- $oldsymbol{8}$ for perpetuating the spirit of aloha that is vital to the
- $oldsymbol{9}$ economic success of the industry. The National Academy of
- 10 Recording Arts and Sciences has recently added the new category
- 11 of best Hawaiian Music Album to the prestigious Grammy Awards,
- 12 thereby creating new audiences for Hawaiian music around the
- world.
- 14 The legislature further finds that the history of Hawaiian
- 15 music and dance demonstrates a proud statement of cultural
- 16 identity. A compilation of collective works and related
- 17 memorabilia of exceptional individuals who are highly regarded

- 10 and recommendations to the legislature no later than twenty days
- 11 prior to the convening of the regular session of 2007.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Description:

Establishes the museum of Hawaiian music and dance committee to determine the appropriate type of institution that should be established, its location, possible financing mechanisms, and to complete an initial business plan for the museum of Hawaiian music and dance. (SD1)
