## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 Section 286-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is SECTION 1. amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 2 Every certificate of registration issued under this 3 part shall expire at midnight on December 31 of each year and 4 shall be renewed annually before April 1 of each year upon 5 application by the registered owner by presentation of the last 6 issued certificate of registration or the last issued 7 application for renewal, such renewal to take effect as of 8 January 1 of each year; provided that the certificate of 9 10 registration for each motor vehicle in the counties of the State may be renewed on a staggered basis, if a county elects to do 11 so. The director of finance of each county may adopt rules to 12 carry out the purposes stated in this section and shall expend 13 14 the necessary funds from the director's operating funds as may be necessary for these purposes[; provided that the director of 15 finance, if the director has ascertained as of the date of the 16 application that the registered owner has not deposited or paid 17 bail with respect to any summons or citation issued to the 18



1 registered owner for stopping, standing, or parking in violation 2 of traffic ordinances within the county, may require, as a 3 condition precedent to the renewal, that the registered owner 4 deposit or pay bail with respect to all such summons or citations]. The certificates of registration issued hereunder 5 6 shall show, in addition to all information required under 7 section 286-47, the serial number of the tag or emblem and shall be valid during the registration year only for which they are 8 9 issued. The certificates of ownership need not be renewed annually but shall remain valid as to any interest shown therein 10 until canceled by the director of finance as provided by law or 11 replaced by new certificates of ownership as hereinafter 12 **13** provided." 14 SECTION 2. Section 286-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: Subsection (b), requiring a transferee to forward the 16 17 certificate of ownership after endorsement to the director of 18 finance, shall not apply to the transferee of a vehicle who was not intending to and does not drive the vehicle or permit the 19 vehicle to be driven upon the public highways, but every such 20 transferee, upon transferring the transferee's interest or title 21

to another, shall give notice of the transfer to the director of

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finance and endorse the certificate of ownership to the new 1 2 legal owner and the certificate of registration to the new 3 owner[; provided that if the director of finance has ascertained 4 as of the date of the application that the registered owner has 5 not deposited or paid bail with respect to any summons or 6 citation issued to the registered owner for stopping, standing, 7 or parking in violation of traffic ordinances within the county, the director may require, as a condition precedent to the 8 9 transfer, that the registered owner deposit or pay bail with 10 respect to all such summons or citations.]" SECTION 3. Section 291D-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 12 amended to read as follows: 13 "§291D-10 Restriction on driver's license [and motor **vehicle registration**]. [(a)] When the person issued a notice 14 15 of traffic infraction [not involving parking] fails to pay the total amount of fines, fees, surcharges, costs, or monetary 16 assessments that has been ordered, the court shall cause an 17 18 entry to be made in the driver's license record so as to prevent 19 the person from acquiring or renewing the person's driver's 20 license until the outstanding amount is paid or the notice of 21 traffic infraction is otherwise disposed of pursuant to this 22 chapter.

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1 [(b) In all cases where the registered owner of a motor vehicle to which a notice of traffic infraction has been issued 3 fails to pay the total amount of fines, fees, surcharges, costs, 4 or monetary assessments that have been ordered, the court shall 5 cause an entry to be made in the motor vehicle's record so as to 6 prevent issuance or renewal of the motor vehicle's certificate of registration and transfer of title to the motor vehicle until 7 the outstanding amount is paid or the notice of traffic 8 infraction is otherwise disposed of pursuant to this chapter.] " 9 10 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 12 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
