## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The senate and house of representatives of the 2 twenty-third legislature of the State of Hawaii, regular session 3 of 2005, enacted Act 196, Relating to Housing, and section 35 of 4 that act established the joint legislative housing and homeless 5 task force to further identify near-term solutions to Hawaii's 6 affordable housing and homeless problem. The task force issued 7 its report with findings and recommendations in January 2006. 8 The task force recommended in general that the State: (1) 9 leverage more sources of financing for affordable housing; (2) 10 make available more public land for the development of 11 affordable housing; (3) streamline government approvals and 12 permitting of affordable housing projects; (4) build more 13 offsite infrastructure to serve affordable housing: (5) 14 appropriate additional funds for transitional housing, shelters, 15 and services for the homeless population; and (6) preserve and 16 maintain the existing public housing stock.
- The specific recommendations of the task force for studies relating to affordable housing include: (1) authorizing a study

- 1 identifying available land from the large estates that are
- 2 divesting their holdings, or lands previously used for sugar and
- 3 pineapple plantations, that could be developed for affordable
- 4 housing, and examining the feasibility of having the State
- 5 acquire those lands for affordable housing development through a
- 6 land bank or land trust; and (2) directing the legislative

- 13 The purpose of this Act is to implement the recommendations
- 14 of the task force with regard to identifying available land for
- 15 affordable housing and preparing a plan for retaining subsidized
- 16 affordable units eligible for conversion to market-priced
- 17 housing.
- 18 SECTION 2. The office of planning shall identify available
- 19 land from the large estates that could be developed for
- 20 affordable housing, and examine the feasibility of state
- 21 acquisition of those lands for affordable housing development
- 22 through a land bank or land trust. The office shall report its

- 1 findings and recommendations to the legislature no later than
- 2 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of
- 3 2007.
- 4 SECTION 3. The legislative reference bureau shall: (1)
- 5 study and assess the government-subsidized affordable housing
- 6 projects currently in private ownership that are eligible to
- 7 convert to market-priced housing over the next five years, and
- 8 (2) prepare a plan on the measures and incentives that can be
- 9 implemented, together with cost estimates, to retain these
- 10 projects as affordable housing. The bureau shall report its
- 11 findings and recommendations to the legislature no later than
- 12 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of
- **13** 2007.
- 14 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000, or so much
- 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for the
- 17 purposes of section 2 of this Act.
- 18 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 19 business, economic development and tourism.
- 20 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.

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### Report Title:

Affordable Housing; Land; Estates; Agriculture; Land Bank; Land Trust

#### Description:

Requires the office of planning to identify available private lands for acquisition and development for affordable housing. Requires the legislative reference bureau to study and assess private government-subsidized housing and prepare a plan to retain these projects as affordable housing. Appropriates funds for the purposes of the Act.
