A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 88-75, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended to read as follows: 2 "§88-75 Ordinary disability retirement. (a) 3 application of a member in service or on leave without pay, or 4
- the person appointed by the family court as guardian of an 5
- 6 incapacitated member, any member who has ten or more years of
- credited service shall be retired by the board of trustees on an 7
- 8 ordinary disability retirement allowance if the medical board,
- after a medical examination of the member, certifies that: 9
- The member is mentally or physically incapacitated for 10 (1)11 the further performance of duty at the time of 12 application;
- The incapacity is likely to be permanent; and 13 (2)

- 15 Notwithstanding the requirement of subsection (a)(1), (b)
- 16 if a member has been diagnosed with, and at the time of applying

- extent that the member's physical or mental condition has 1 deteriorated so as to require the member to immediately retire, 2 3 the medical board shall render a decision on the member's eligibility for retirement within thirty days of the medical 4 board's receipt of a written statement, from the member's 5 primary care physician or a physician who specializes in the 6 diagnosis of the incurable debilitating disease, certifying that 7 8 the member has been diagnosed with, and at the time of the ordinary disability retirement application, suffers from the 9 symptoms of an incurable debilitating disease. Within thirty 10 11 days of the medical board's decision on whether a member's 12 medical condition qualifies as an incurable debilitating 13 disease, the system shall render a decision on the member's 14 retirement application and notify the member of the system's 15 decision. (c) No time limit for retirement from the system shall be 16 17 imposed upon a member who qualifies for ordinary disability retirement under subsection (b), and the member may continue in 18 19 the member's public sector employment until such time as the 20 member elects to terminate service and retire. For the purposes of this section, "incurable debilitating
