## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the research and 1 training revolving fund was established in 1974 to pay for 2 research and training activities at the University. The state 3 auditor, in a 2004 report (04-13), found that the research and 4 training revolving fund "does not meet all criteria for a 5 revolving fund." The legislature found that the University of 6 7 Hawaii's corrective action to the state auditor's finding was to reclassify the research and training revolving fund as a special 8 9 fund. In addition, a November 9, 2001 report of the president's 10 special task force on research infrastructure at the University 11 of Hawaii proposed remedies to what the University of Hawaii 12 association of research investigators described as impediments 13 to the conduct of research at the University of Hawaii. 14 task force recommended that "overhead recovery by UH must be 15

    reclassified as a special fund and that all of its funds should

## Description:
