A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the research and 2 training revolving fund was established in 1974 to pay for 3 research and training activities at the University of Hawaii. 4 The state auditor, in a 2004 report (04-13), found that the research and training revolving fund "does not meet all criteria 5 for a revolving fund." The legislature found that the 6 7 University of Hawaii's corrective action to the state auditor's 8 finding was to reclassify the research and training revolving 9 fund as a special fund. 10 In addition, a November 9, 2001 report of the president's 11 special task force on research infrastructure at the University 12 of Hawaii proposed remedies to what the University of Hawaii association of research investigators described as impediments 13 14 to the conduct of research at the University of Hawaii. task force recommended that "overhead recovery by UH must be 15
- 17 'in equipment, technical support and faculty salary to remain

reinvested in the research infrastructure, to permit investments

18 competitive." The report expressed concern that a:

1	substantial fraction of the total on indirect	
2	costs that are recovered have been allocated to	
3	activities that do not directly support research	
4	and do not qualify as recoverable costs. During	
5	the past 8 years, 12% of the UH ICR has been	
6	allocated to the Housing Assistance Revolving	
7	Fund (HARF) by legislative mandate without any	
8	consideration of the amount (\$2.47m in FY01), its	
9	intended uses or any demonstrated need. An	
10	additional 4% (\$824K in FY01) has been redirected	
11	to the Discovery and Inventions Revolving Fund	
12	(DIRF), an internal entity that has not been	
13	adequately coordinated with the rest of the	
14	research enterprise.	
15	The legislature believes that the current unfunded deferred	
16	maintenance backlog of \$175,000,000, as well as other equipment	
17	repair and replacement needs that are related to research	
18	activities, will benefit by retaining the moneys received from	
19	all indirect cost recovery efforts in the University of Hawaii	
20	research and training revolving fund. The legislature also	
21	believes that the University of Hawaii research and training	
22	revolving fund should be reclassified as a special fund and that	

1 all of its funds should be reinvested in the research 2 infrastructure. 3 SECTION 2. Section 304-8.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending its title and subsections (a), (b), and (c) 4 to read as follows: 5 6 "§304-8.1 Research and training [revolving] special fund. 7 There is established a University of Hawaii research and training [revolving] special fund into which shall be deposited 8 9 one hundred per cent of the total amount of indirect overhead 10 revenues generated by the university from research and training 11 The board of regents of the University of Hawaii is 12 authorized to expend one hundred per cent of the revenues deposited in the fund for: 13 Research and training purposes which may result in 14 (1)15 additional research and training grants and contracts; 16 (2) Facilitating research and training at the university; 17 and [Further deposit into the discoveries and inventions 18 (3) 19 revolving fund and the University of Hawaii housing 20 assistance revolving-fund. Repair and replacement of

research related equipment and facilities.

- 14 SECTION 4. Section 304-8.96, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

- "(a) There is established a housing assistance revolving
- 17 fund [into which shall be deposited a portion of the total
- 18 indirect overhead funds generated by the university for research
- 19 and training purposes in the prior fiscal year as determined by
- 20 the board of regents]. The fund shall be used to:

4	(2)	Account for all transactions of the university housing
