A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes that, according to 1 the national center for public policy and higher education, net 2 3 college costs for low- and middle-income students to attend Hawaii's public four-year colleges and universities represent a 4 third of their families' annual income. In 2004, the national 5 non-profit independent organization gave Hawaii a "D" for 6 affordability. The organization also noted that "over the past 7 few years, Hawaii has had among the steepest declines in the 8 9 nation in the percentage of first-time, full-time college 10 students earning their bachelor's degree within six years of 11 enrolling in college." During the 2005 legislative session, recognizing the need 12 13 to provide financial support to Hawaii's residents in attaining 14 a post secondary degree, the legislature appropriated \$1,500,000 15 in general funds for the fiscal biennium 2005-2007 to provide merit-based scholarships for Hawaii's low-income public school 16

graduates wishing to attend the university. Despite this

appropriation, the legislature finds that the increases in the

- 1 tuition and fee schedule, which takes effect in the fall of
- 2 2006, will continue to make it difficult for Hawaii's residents
- 3 to attend the university. The legislature also finds that the
- 4 initial appropriation of \$1,500,000 is not sufficient to enroll
- 5 a significant proportion of the estimated number of eligible
- 6 applicants.
- 7 Given the State's current financial surplus, and based on
- 8 input from the University, the purpose of this Act is to amend
- 9 section 57 of Act 178, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, by
- 10 increasing the 2006-2007 appropriation by \$2,000,000 and by
- 11 making technical nonsubstantive amendments.
- 12 SECTION 2. Act 178, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, is
- amended by amending section 57 to read as follows:
- "SECTION 57. Provided that of the general fund
- 15 appropriation for the university of Hawaii systemwide (UOH 900),
- 16 the sum of \$500,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for
- 17 fiscal year 2005-2006, and the sum of [\$1,000,000] \$3,000,000 or
- 18 so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007,
- 19 shall be deposited into the student scholarship and assistance
- 20 special fund; provided further that the amounts shall be used to
- 21 fund the [B-Plus] B Plus Scholarship program; provided further
- 22 that the university shall offer [full scholarships to any

- 1 Hawaii resident [applying to] enrolling in any campus within the
- 2 university system provided that the individual has graduated
- 3 from a Hawaii public high school with a cumulative grade point
- 4 average of 3.0 or better and is considered low income according
- 5 to [the state of Hawaii department of education's guidelines for
- 6 students qualifying for the free and reduced lunch program.
- 7 federal financial aid guidelines; and the scholarship may be
- 8 renewed annually if the student maintains satisfactory academic
- 9 progress."
- 10 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
