A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE NATURAL HEALING RESEARCH FOUNDATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that integrating proven
- 2 natural healing practices with conventional medicine is
- 3 important to the future of health care in Hawaii. The mission
- 4 of the Natural Healing Research Foundation (NHRF) is to research
- 5 natural and plant-based healing practices that complement
- 6 conventional medicine and to promote education and awareness of
- 7 the benefits of natural healing.
- 8 The NHRF has received an unprecedented level of support for
- 9 its work and benefit to the community. Through the support of
- 10 Senator Akaka, Governor Lingle, and the previous legislature,
- 11 the NHRF has obtained ten acres of land in Haiku, Oahu in order
- 12 to continue its important mission.
- 13 The Haiku property will serve as headquarters for the NHRF
- 14 to engage in a critical pilot research program with the
- 15 University of Hawaii. This program will research diseases such
- 16 as heart disease, diabetes, asthma, and obesity, that afflict a
- 17 disproportionate number of Hawaiians. Additionally, the NHRF

- 1 will partner with Hawaiian health organizations and local
- 2 hospitals to offer programs which incorporate its research of
- 3 natural healing and the benefits to Hawaiians in high-risk
- 4 groups.
- 5 The NHRF will continue its educational mission by
- 6 constructing an herbal garden based on healing properties of
- 7 different plants, trees, and vegetables. This garden will serve
- 8 as a live, educational museum in which visitors will learn how
- 9 different plants can positively affect their health, prevent
- 10 cancer, assist in cures, and be integrated into conventional
- 11 medical treatments.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to demonstrate strong
- 13 legislative support for the importance of natural healing
- 14 research in Hawaii and to promote education and awareness of
- 15 proven plant-based natural healing practices by making an
- 16 appropriation to the Natural Healing Research Foundation.
- 17 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000, or so
- 19 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, as a
- 20 grant pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for the
- 21 Natural Healing Research Foundation to continue its natural

- 1 healing and plant-based healing research programs and health
- 2 education.

- 3 SECTION 3. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
- 4 department of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
