A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TOBACCO.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 709-908, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 2 "\$709-908 Tobacco; minors. (1) It shall be unlawful to 3 sell or furnish tobacco in any shape or form, including chewing 4 tobacco and snuff, to a minor under eighteen years of age. 5 Signs using the statement, "The sale of tobacco 6 (2) 7 products to persons under eighteen is prohibited", shall be posted on or near any vending machine in letters at least 8 9 one-half inch high and at or near the point of sale of any other 10 location where tobacco products are sold in letters at least 11 one-half inch high. 12 It shall be unlawful for a minor under eighteen years 13 of age to purchase any tobacco product, as described under 14 subsection (1). This provision does not apply if a person under

the age of eighteen, with parental authorization, is

participating in a controlled purchase as part of a law
