### A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the United States 1 Army's 68th Medical Company's Medical Assistance to Safety and 2 Traffic helicopter has served Hawaii for the past thirty-one 3 years. This military aeromedical helicopter has transported 4 over seven thousand patients and saved countless lives by 5 transporting patients from rural areas, particularly in West 6 Oahu and the North Shore of Oahu to tertiary hospitals. Located 7 at Wheeler Army Air Field, the aeromedical helicopter provides a 8 vital service at no cost to rural Oahu. 9 However, the legislature also finds that due to the 10 increased military activity in Afghanistan, Somalia, and Iraq, 11 the aeromedical helicopter may soon be deployed to those areas, 12 leaving rural Oahu residents without aeromedical services. 13 Legislature believes that providing intra-island aeromedical 14 services to rural Oahu is necessary for the health and safety of 15
- 16 residents and therefore is a matter of statewide concern.
- 17 It is not the intent of this Act to supplant existing
  18 ground or fixed-wing transport, especially for routine or non-

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- emergency inter-facility transportation. The aeromedical 1 helicopter unit would utilize triage protocols to ensure the 2 medically appropriate dispatch of the unit. Helicopter 3 utilization would be based on national aeromedical triage and 4 transport guidelines as established by the Association of Air 5 Medical Services, the American College of Surgeons, and the 6 National Association of Emergency Medical Services Physicians. 7 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to provide 8 intra-island only aeromedical services to rural Oahu. 9 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$600,000, or so much 11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for a 12 grant-in-aid to the director of health to contract with an 13 existing government agency or United States military unit to 14 provide intra-island only roto-wing aeromedical services for 15 rural Oahu; provided that the emergency aeromedical helicopter 16 17 services: Shall not supplant existing ground or fixed-wing 18 (1)transport, especially for routine or non-emergency 19 inter-facility transportation; and 20
- 22 aeromedical, triage, and transport guidelines

Shall use triage protocols that are based on national

2	Services, the American college of Surgeons, and the
3	National Association of Emergency Medical Services
4	Physicians.
5	SECTION 3. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
6	department of health for the purposes of this Act.
7	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
