## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE COUNTIES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 7 of article XII of the Constitution of 1 the State of Hawaii provides, in part, that "The State reaffirms 2 and shall protect all rights, customarily and traditionally 3 exercised for subsistence, cultural and religious purposes 4 . . . by native Hawaiians." Section 7-1, Hawaii Revised 5 Statutes, further reserves the right of the people to take 6 house-timber from lands upon which they reside. Further, 7 chapter 36 of the Maui county code allows the use of indigenous 8 9 Hawaiian architecture in the design and construction of 10 structures in the county of Maui. 11 The purpose of this Act is to allow the use of the 12 techniques, styles, and customs of indigenous Hawaiian 13 architecture to be employed in present-day construction in the 14 state. SECTION 2. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended

- by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 16
- read as follows: 17

1	" <u>§46-</u> <u>Indigenous Hawaiian architecture.</u> (a) Each
2	county shall adopt ordinances allowing the exercise of
3	indigenous native Hawaiian architectural practices, styles,
4	customs, techniques, and materials historically employed by
5	native Hawaiians, in the county's building code, including but
6	not limited to residential and other structures comprised of
7	either rock wall or wood frame walls covered by thatches of
8	different native grasses or other natural material for roofs.
9	(b) The application of indigenous Hawaiian architecture
10	shall be permitted in all zoning districts; provided it is
11	consistent with the intent and purpose of the uniquely
12	designated, special, or historic district."
13	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
