A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILDREN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 128, Regular
2	Session 2	005, requested the department of public safety and the
3	departmen	t of human services to jointly establish a task force
4	to examin	e issues affecting the children of incarcerated parents
5	and to pr	opose solutions to those issues, as well as methods to
6	break the	cycle of crime and violence in these families.
7	Specifica	lly, the task force was requested to:
8	(1)	Develop a system to identify children of incarcerated
9		parents;
10	(2)	Develop programs and support services for these
11		children;
12	(3)	Provide support for incarcerated parents, where
13		appropriate; and
14	(4)	Develop programs to strengthen these families.
15	Duri	ng the interim period following the 2005 regular
16	session,	the department of public safety and the department of
17	human ser	rvices established the children of incarcerated parents
12	tack forc	re as requested. The task force met three times, but

- 1 there was insufficient time to adequately research, discuss, and
- 2 prepare feasible proposals for programs to address the needs of
- 3 children of incarcerated parents.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to extend the term of the
- 5 children of incarcerated parents task force so it can continue
- 6 to develop programs to aid children of incarcerated parents, to
- 7 strengthen these families, and to break the cycle of crime and
- 8 violence within them.
- 9 SECTION 2. (a) The children of incarcerated parents task
- 10 force, which was established by Senate Concurrent Resolution No.
- 11 128, regular session 2005, shall continue to operate through
- 12 December 31, 2007. The task force shall be attached to the
- 13 department of human services for administrative purposes.
- 14 (b) The task force shall include members as follows:
- 15 (1) The director of public safety or a designee;
- 16 (2) The deputy director of the corrections division of the
- department of public safety or a designee;
- 18 (3) The institutions division administrator of the
- 19 community correctional centers and the correctional
- 20 facilities or a designee;
- 21 (4) The director of health or a designee;
- 22 (5) The director of human services or a designee;

1	(6)	The executive director of the office of youth services
2		or a designee;
3	(7)	The chief justice of the supreme court or a designee;
4	(8)	A member of the board of trustees of the office of
5		Hawaiian affairs or a designee;
6	(9)	A representative of the family court of the first
7		circuit;
8	(10)	The superintendent of education or a designee;
9	(11)	The attorney general or a designee;
10	(12)	The prosecuting attorney of each county or a designee;
11	(13)	A representative of child protective services;
12	(14)	The director of the Children's Justice Center of Oahu
13		or a designee;
14	(15)	A representative from the adult probation division;
15	(16)	A member representing each of the county police
16		departments appointed by the respective police chiefs;
17	(17)	A public member with advocacy experience working on
18		behalf of children of incarcerated parents to be
19		selected by Blueprint for Change;
20	(18)	A public member with advocacy experience working on
21		behalf of children of incarcerated parents to be
22		selected by Child and Family Services;

1	(19)	A public member with advocacy experience working on
2		behalf of children of incarcerated parents to be
3		selected by the Community Alliance on Prisons;
4	(20)	A public member with advocacy experience working on
5		behalf of children of incarcerated parents to be
6		selected by the Good Beginnings Alliance;
7	(21)	A public member with advocacy experience working on
8		behalf of children of incarcerated parents to be
9		selected by the Hawaii Juvenile Justice Project;
10	(22)	A public member with advocacy experience working on
11		behalf of children of incarcerated parents to be
12		selected by Keiki O Ka Aina Family Learning Centers;
13	(23)	A public member with advocacy experience working on
14		behalf of children of incarcerated parents to be
15		selected by Neighborhood Place of Puna;
16	(24)	A public member with advocacy experience working on
17		behalf of children of incarcerated parents to be
18		selected by Neighborhood Place of Wailuku;
19	(25)	Public members with experience working with children
20		of incarcerated parents to be selected by the
21		Children's Justice Center;

1	(26)	A representative of the Queen Liliuokalani Children's
2		Center;
3	(27)	A faculty member of the University of Hawaii
4		department of sociology or a designee; and
5	(28)	The administrator of the intake service centers of the
6		department of public safety or a designee.
7	(c)	The task force shall:
8	(1)	Develop a system to identify children of incarcerated
9		parents in Hawaii and to make referrals as
10		appropriate;
11	(2)	Determine the impact that parental incarceration has
12		on children of incarcerated parents;
13	(3)	Identify the needs of children of incarcerated parents
14		and develop responsive programs;
15	(4)	Identify local programs and models, including neighbor
16		island programs and models; and
17	(5)	Review other jurisdictions' activities, policies,
18		directives, and laws relating to children of
19		incarcerated parents and derive best practices models
20		therefrom.
21	(4)	The members of the task force shall select the

chairperson of the task force from among themselves and shall be

- 1 reimbursed for expenses, including travel expenses, necessary
- 2 for the performance of their duties.
- 3 (e) The department of public safety and the department of
- 4 human services shall each provide support services necessary to
- 5 assist the task force in achieving its purpose as required under
- 6 this Act.
- 7 (f) This task force shall cease to exist after
- 8 December 31, 2007.
- 9 (q) The task force shall publish and present a final
- 10 report to the legislature and the general public no later than
- 11 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of
- 12 2008. The report shall be available in printed form and on a
- 13 website accessible to the public over the Internet.
- 14 The final report shall include:
- 15 (1) A summary of significant findings regarding children
- of incarcerated parents;
- 17 (2) Statistics indicating the number of children with
- incarcerated parents in the State, including data on
- age, educational, financial, geographic, and
- 20 socioeconomic demographics of incarcerated parents;

1	(3)	Data and analysis to determine the relationship
2		between specific variables and frequency of parental
3		incarceration;
4	(4)	Data and analysis to determine the relationship
5		between parental incarceration and various adverse
6		outcomes for children of incarcerated parents;
7	(5)	Case studies of children of incarcerated parents;
8	(6)	Recommendations as to whether the task force should be
9		further extended;
10	(7)	Multiple theoretical models for improving the welfare
11		and general well-being of children of incarcerated
12		parents; and
13	(8)	Proposed legislation, if any.
14	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
15	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$25,000, or so much
16	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for
17	reimburse	ment for expenses, including travel expenses, incurred
18	by members of the children of incarcerated parents task force	
19	and for a	ny administrative costs of the task force.
20	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
