## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PSYCHOTROPIC MEDICATION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature passed Act 239 during the
- 2 regular session of 2005 in recognition of the importance of
- 3 providing open access to medications utilized to treat mental
- 4 illness. Act 239 applied to individuals in the medicaid
- 5 fee-for-service program. The legislature finds that Act 239 has
- 6 been successful in treating mental illness and further finds
- 7 that all medicaid and medicare recipients should have access to
- 8 the same benefits.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to improve access to
- 10 psychotropic medication for participants in all medicaid and
- 11 medicare plans.
- 12 SECTION 2. Act 239, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, is
- 13 amended by amending sections 2 and 3 to read as follows:
- 14 "SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately
- 16 designated and to read as follows:
- 17 "\$346- Psychotropic medication. (a) The department
- 18 shall not impose any restriction or limitation on the coverage



- 1 for, or a recipient's access to, psychotropic medication;
- 2 provided that the psychotropic medication shall be prescribed by
- 3 a licensed psychiatrist or by a licensed physician [in
- 4 consultation with a psychiatrist] duly licensed in the State.
- 5 (b) As used in this section:
- 6 ["Consultation" means communication by telephone,
- 7 electronically, or face to face by a licensed psychiatrist and a
- 8 licensed physician, during which the psychiatrist concurs with
- 9 the prescription made. The psychiatrist's concurring opinion
- 10 shall be documented in the recipient's medical record.
- 11 "Psychotropic medication" means only those agents approved
- 12 by the United States Food and Drug Administration for the
- 13 treatment of mental or emotional disorders.
- 14 (c) This section shall [not] apply to [QUEST] all Hawaii
- 15 <u>medicaid</u> medical plans.
- 16 §346- Pre-authorization exemption for psychotropic
- 17 medication. (a) A licensed physician may prescribe
- 18 psychotropic medication pursuant to the laws of this State to an
- 19 individual who is medicaid eligible without the requirement of
- 20 any preauthorization procedure otherwise required by any other
- 21 provision of this chapter; provided that the individual is in
- 22 need of emergency psychiatric or psychological service.

- 1 (b) As used in this section:
- 2 "Emergency psychiatric or psychological service" means
- 3 immediate administration or prescription of psychotropic
- 4 medication not to exceed seven days by a licensed physician is
- 5 required to avoid or mitigate significant adverse effects to the
- 6 individual's mental or emotional condition.
- 7 "Psychotropic medication" means only those agents approved
- 8 by the United States Food and Drug Administration for the
- 9 treatment of mental or emotional disorders.
- 10 (c) This section shall [not] apply to [QUEST] all Hawaii
- 11 medicaid medical plans.
- 12 SECTION 3. The department of human services shall report
- 13 to the legislature no later than twenty days before the
- 14 convening of the regular session of [2007] 2008. The report
- 15 shall include:
- 16 (1) The number of prescriptions written pursuant to this
- 17 Act;
- 18 (2) The cost and impact of psychiatrists or physicians
- 19 prescribing medications pursuant to this Act that are
- 20 not part of the existing formulary; and
- 21 (3) The overall utilization under chapter 346, Hawaii
- 22 Revised Statutes.""

- 1 SECTION 3. Act 239, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, is
- 2 amended by amending section 5 to read as follows:
- 3 "SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2005[7
- 4 and shall be repealed on June 30, 2007]."
- 5 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
