## A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR A HEALTH CARE PILOT PROJECT.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes the continuing high 1 costs of healthcare and pharmaceutical drugs. Healthy 2 decisions, such as exercising, eating well, or avoiding tobacco, 3 can lead to good overall health and well being and reduce the 4 risks for premature illness and death. The legislature also 5 acknowledges the important contributions of multi-cultural 6 lifestyle medicine to healthy choices. 7 The legislature further recognizes the importance and 8 benefit of establishing a world-class integrative medical center 9 to help the State become a leader in health science. Providing 10 infrastructure for complementary medicine program grants to the 11 University of Hawaii and supporting the Brown and Bakken World 12 Health Awards programs will also help the State establish itself 13
- The purpose of this Act is to:

20	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ , or so		
21	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for		
22	a grant t	o Hawaii Health Foundation, for the following projects:
