## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to regulate
2	individuals offering genetic counseling services and to:
3	(1) Safeguard the public health, safety, and welfare;
4	(2) Protect those seeking genetic counseling services from
5	incompetent and unscrupulous persons, and persons
6	unauthorized to perform these services;
7	(3) Assure the highest degree of professional conduct on
8	the part of genetic counselors; and
9	(4) Assure the availability of high quality genetic
10	counseling services.
11	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
12	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
13	as follows:
14	"CHAPTER
15	GENETIC COUNSELORS
16	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
17	"Board certified" means an individual who has passed the
18	American Board of Genetic Counseling certification examination



- 1 and remains actively certified by American Board of Genetic
- 2 Counseling.
- 3 "Board eligible" means an individual who has documentation
- 4 of eligibility to take the American Board of Genetic Counseling
- 5 certification examinations.
- 6 "Department" means the department of commerce and consumer
- 7 affairs.
- 8 "Director" means the director of commerce and consumer
- 9 affairs.
- 10 "Genetic counselor" means a person licensed under this
- 11 chapter who engages in genetic counseling practice.
- "Genetic counseling practice" means the communication
- 13 process which deals with the human problems associated with the
- 14 occurrence, or the risk of occurrence, of a genetic disorder in
- 15 a family, including the provision of services to help an
- 16 individual or family:
- 17 (1) Comprehend the medical facts, including the diagnosis,
- 18 probable cause of the disorder, and available
- management of the disorder;
- 20 (2) Appreciate the way heredity contributes to the
- 21 disorder and the risk of its occurrence in specified
- 22 relatives;

1	(3)	Understand	the	alternatives	for	dealing	with	the	risk
2		of occurrer	ice;						

- 3 (4) Choose the course of action which seems appropriate in
  4 view of the risk, family goals, and the individual's
  5 ethical and religious standards, and to act in
  6 accordance with that decision; and
- 7 (5) Make the best possible psychosocial adjustment to the disorder in an affected family member or to the risk of occurrence of that disorder.
- "Licensed genetic counselor" means an individual who holds

  a license in good standing to practice genetic counseling under

  this chapter.
- § -2 Genetic counseling licensure program. There is established a genetic counseling licensure program within the department to be administered by the director.
- 16 § -3 Powers and duties of the director. In addition to
  17 any other powers and duties authorized by law, the director
  18 shall have the following powers and duties:
- 19 (1) Examine and approve the qualifications of all
  20 applicants under this chapter and issue a license to
  21 each successful applicant granting permission to use
  22 the title of "licensed genetic counselor" or "genetic

1		counselor" in this State pursuant to this chapter and
2		the rules adopted pursuant thereto;
3	(2)	Adopt, amend, or repeal rules pursuant to chapter 91
4		as the director finds necessary to carry out this
5		chapter;
6	(3)	Administer, coordinate, and enforce this chapter and
7		rules adopted pursuant thereto;
8	(4)	Discipline a licensed genetic counselor for any cause
9		described by this chapter or for any violation of the
10		rules, and refuse to license an individual for failure
11		to meet licensure requirements or for any cause that
12		would be grounds for disciplining a licensed genetic
13		counselor; and
14	(5)	Direct the department of health genetics program to
15		assist with the implementation of this chapter and the
16		rules adopted pursuant thereto.
17	\$	-4 Licensure required. No individual shall purport to
18	be a lice	nsed genetic counselor or use the letters "L.G.C." in
19	connection	n with the individual's name, or use any words or
20	symbols in	ndicating or tending to indicate that the individual is
21	a license	d genetic counselor without meeting the applicable

requirements and holding a license as set forth in this chapter.

1	§	-5 Exemptions. (a) This chapter does not prohibit
2	any perso	ns legally regulated in this State by any other law
3	from enga	ging in the practice for which they are authorized as
4	long as t	hey do not represent themselves by the title of
5	"genetic	counselor" or "licensed genetic counselor." This
6	chapter d	oes not prohibit the practice of non-regulated
7	professio	ns whose practitioners are engaged in the delivery of
8	human ser	vices as long as these practitioners do not represent
9	themselve	s as or use the title of "genetic counselor" or
10	"licensed	genetic counselor."
11	(b)	Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to limit
12	the activ	ities and services of:
13	(1)	A student, intern, resident, or fellow in genetic
14		counseling or genetics seeking to fulfill educational
15		requirements to qualify for a license under this
16		chapter if those activities and services constitute a
17		part of the student's supervised course of study; or
18	(2)	An individual seeking to fulfill the post-degree
19		practice requirements to qualify for licensing under
20		this chapter, as long as the activities and services
21		are supervised by a qualified supervisor. A student,

intern, resident, or fellow must be designated by the

- title "intern," "resident," "fellow," or any other

  designation of trainee status. Nothing contained in

  this subsection shall be construed to permit students,

  interns, residents, or fellows to offer their services

  as genetic counselors or geneticists to any other

  person.
- 7 (c) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prevent
  8 a physician licensed to practice medicine in this State or
  9 intern, fellow, or resident from performing genetic counseling
  10 within the person's scope of practice as long as the person is
  11 not in any manner held out to the public as a "genetic
  12 counselor" or "licensed genetic counselor."
- (d) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prevent
  any licensed nurse in this State from performing genetic
  counseling within the nurse's scope of practice as long as the
  nurse is not in any manner held out to the public as a "genetic
  counselor" or "licensed genetic counselor."
- (e) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prevent
  any licensed social worker, licensed psychologist, licensed
  marriage and family therapist from practicing professional
  counseling in this State as long as that person is not in any
  manner held out to the public as a "genetic counselor" or

- 1 "licensed genetic counselor" and does not hold out his or her
- 2 services as being genetic counseling.
- 3 § -6 Licensure requirements. The director shall adopt
- 4 rules as deemed necessary for the licensure of genetic
- 5 counselors to protect public health and safety and may consider
- 6 the following factors as evidence in determining whether an
- 7 applicant is qualified to be licensed:
- 8 (1) The applicant is board certified by the American Board
- 10 (2) A report of any disciplinary action or rejections of
- license applications or renewals relating to genetic
- 12 counseling practice taken against the applicant in
- another jurisdiction.
- 14 § -7 Provisional license. The director shall grant,
- 15 upon application and payment of proper fees, provisional
- 16 licensure to an individual who, at the time of application, is
- 17 documented to be board eligible by the American Board of Genetic
- 18 Counseling. Provisional licenses will only be issued for a
- 19 maximum of four years from the time of granting of the
- 20 provisional license.
- 21 § -8 Licensure by endorsement. The director shall
- 22 grant, upon application and payment of proper fees, licensure to

- 1 an individual who, at the time of application, holds a valid
- 2 license as a genetic counselor issued by another state,
- 3 territory, or jurisdiction if the requirements for that
- 4 certification or license are equal to, or greater than, the
- 5 requirements of this chapter.
- 6 § -9 Issuance of license. The director shall issue a
- 7 license to any individual who meets the requirements of this
- 8 chapter, upon payment of the prescribed fees.
- 9 S -10 Renewal of license. (a) Every license issued
- 10 under this chapter shall be renewed annually on or before
- 11 June 30, with the first renewal deadline occurring on July 1,
- 12 2008. Failure to renew a license shall result in a forfeiture
- 13 of the license. Licenses that have been so forfeited may be
- 14 restored within one year of the expiration date upon payment of
- 15 renewal and penalty fees. Failure to restore a forfeited
- 16 license within six months of the date of its expiration shall
- 17 result in the automatic termination of the license, and re-
- 18 licensure may require the individual to apply as a new
- 19 applicant.
- **20** (b) An applicant who is board eligible shall obtain
- 21 American Board of Genetic Counseling certification within two

- 1 examination cycles to continue to be eligible for license
- 2 renewal.
- 3 § -11 Application for licensure. (a) Application for a
- 4 license shall be made on an application form to be furnished by
- 5 the department of commerce and consumer affairs. An applicant
- 6 shall provide the following information on the application form:
- 7 (1) The applicant's legal name;
- 8 (2) The applicant's current residence and business mailing
  9 addresses and phone numbers;
- 10 (3) The applicant's social security number;
- 11 (4) The date and place of any conviction of a penal crime
  12 directly related to the profession or vocation in
  13 which the applicant is applying for licensure, unless
  14 the conviction has been expunged or annulled, or is
  15 otherwise precluded from consideration by section
- **16** 831-3.1;
- 17 (5) Proof that the applicant is a United States citizen, a

  18 United States national, or an alien authorized to work

  19 in the United States;
- 20 (6) Disclosure of similar licensure in any state or 21 territory;

- (7) Disclosure of disciplinary action by any state or
   territory against any license held by the applicant;
   and
- 4 (8) Any other information the licensing authority may
  5 require to investigate the applicant's qualifications
  6 for licensure.
- 7 Failure to provide the above information and pay the required
- 8 fees shall be grounds to deny the application for licensure.
- 9 § -12 Fees; disposition. (a) Application, examination,
- 10 reexamination, license, renewal, late renewal penalty fees,
- 11 inactive, and other reasonable and necessary fees relating to
- 12 administration of this chapter shall be as provided in rules
- 13 adopted by the director pursuant to chapter 91.
- 14 (b) Fees assessed shall defray all costs to be incurred by
- 15 the director to support the operation of the genetic counselor
- 16 licensure program.
- 17 § -13 Revocation, suspension, denial, or condition of
- 18 licenses; fines. In addition to any other acts or conditions
- 19 provided by law, the director may refuse to renew, reinstate, or
- 20 restore, or may deny, revoke, suspend, fine, or condition in any
- 21 manner any license for any one or more of the following acts or

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1	conditions	on	the	part	of	the	applicant	or	licensed	genetic
2	counselor:									

- 3 (1) Conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction of a
  4 crime that the director has determined to be of a
  5 nature that renders the individual convicted unfit to
  6 practice genetic counseling;
  - (2) Failure to report in writing to the director any disciplinary decision or rejection of license application or renewal related to genetic practice issued against the licensed genetic counselor or the applicant in any jurisdiction within thirty days of the disciplinary decision or within twenty days of licensure;
    - (3) Violation of recognized ethical standards for genetic counselors as set by the National Society of Genetic Counselors;
- 17 (4) Use of fraud, deception, or misrepresentation in
  18 obtaining a license;
- (5) Revocation, suspension, or other disciplinary action
   by another state, territory, federal agency, or
   country against the licensed genetic counselor or

1		applicant for any reason provided under this section;
2		or
3	(6)	Other just and sufficient cause that renders an
4		individual unfit to practice genetic counseling.
5	\$	-14 Hearings; appeals. The director will establish a
6	hearing a	nd appeals process for persons who wish to appeal their
7	revocatio	n, suspension, denial, or condition of license.
8	\$	-15 Prohibited acts; penalties. (a) No individual
9	shall:	
10	(1)	Use in connection with the person's name any
11		designation tending to imply that the individual is a
12		licensed genetic counselor unless the individual is
13		duly licensed and authorized under this chapter; or
14	(2)	Make a representation that the individual is a
15		licensed genetic counselor during the time the
16		person's license issued under this chapter is
17		forfeited, inactive, terminated, suspended, or
18		revoked.
19	(b)	Any individual who violates this section shall be
20	subject t	o a fine of not more than \$1,000 and each day's
21	violation	shall be deemed a separate offense."

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on its approval.
