A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to regulate
2	individuals offering genetic counseling services and to:
3	(1) Safeguard the public health, safety, and welfare;
4	(2) Protect those seeking genetic counseling services from
5	incompetent and unscrupulous persons, and persons
6	unauthorized to perform these services;
7	(3) Assure the highest degree of professional conduct on
8	the part of genetic counselors; and
9	(4) Assure the availability of high quality genetic
10	counseling services.
11	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
12	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
13	as follows:
14	"CHAPTER
15	GENETIC COUNSELORS
16	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
17	"Board certified" means an individual who has passed the
18	American Board of Genetic Counseling certification examination



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    and remains actively certified by American Board of Genetic
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    Counseling.
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         "Board eligible" means an individual who has documentation
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    of eligibility to take the American Board of Genetic Counseling
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    certification examinations.
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         "Department" means the department of . .
         "Director" means the director of
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         "Genetic counselor" means a person licensed under this
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    chapter who engages in genetic counseling practice.
         "Genetic counseling practice" means the communication
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    process which deals with the human problems associated with the
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    occurrence, or the risk of occurrence, of a genetic disorder in
    a family, including the provision of services to help an
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    individual or family:
              Comprehend the medical facts, including the diagnosis,
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         (1)
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              probable cause of the disorder, and available
              management of the disorder;
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         (2) Appreciate the way heredity contributes to the
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              disorder and the risk of its occurrence in specified
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              relatives;
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         (3) Understand the alternatives for dealing with the risk
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of occurrence;

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1	(4)	Choose the course of action which seems appropriate in
2		view of the risk, family goals, and the individual's
3		ethical and religious standards, and to act in
4		accordance with that decision; and

- 5 (5) Make the best possible psychosocial adjustment to the disorder in an affected family member or to the risk of occurrence of that disorder.
- 8 "Licensed genetic counselor" means an individual who holds
 9 a license in good standing to practice genetic counseling under
 10 this chapter.
- 11 § -2 Genetic counseling licensure program. There is
 12 established a genetic counseling licensure program within the
 13 department to be administered by the director.
- § -3 Powers and duties of the director. In addition to any other powers and duties authorized by law, the director shall have the following powers and duties:
- 17 (1) Examine and approve the qualifications of all

 18 applicants under this chapter and issue a license to

 19 each successful applicant granting permission to use

 20 the title of "licensed genetic counselor" or "genetic

 21 counselor" in this State pursuant to this chapter and

4	(3)	Administer, coordinate, and enforce this chapter and
5		rules adopted pursuant thereto;

7		described by this chapter or for any violation of the
8		rules, and refuse to license an individual for failure
9		to meet licensure requirements or for any cause that
10	•	would be grounds for disciplining a licensed genetic
11		counselor; and
12	(5)	Direct the department of health genetics program to
13		assist with the implementation of this chapter and the
14		rules adopted pursuant thereto.

- 9 (b) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to limit

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- 1 § -10 Renewal of license. (a) Every license issued
- 2 under this chapter shall be renewed annually on or before
- 3 June 30, with the first renewal deadline occurring on July 1,
- 4 2008. Failure to renew a license shall result in a forfeiture
- 5 of the license. Licenses that have been so forfeited may be
- 6 restored within one year of the expiration date upon payment of
- 7 renewal and penalty fees. Failure to restore a forfeited
- 8 license within six months of the date of its expiration shall
- 9 result in the automatic termination of the license, and re-
- 10 licensure may require the individual to apply as a new
- 11 applicant.
- 12 (b) An applicant who is board eliqible shall obtain
- 13 American Board of Genetic Counseling certification within two
- 14 examination cycles to continue to be eligible for license
- 15 renewal.
- 16 § -11 Application for licensure. (a) Application for a
- 17 license shall be made on an application form to be furnished by
- 18 the department. An applicant shall provide the following
- 19 information on the application form:
- 20 (1) The applicant's legal name;
- 21 (2) The applicant's current residence and business mailing
- 22 addresses and phone numbers;

8	(5)	Proof that the applicant is a United States citizen, a
9		United States national, or an alien authorized to work
10		in the United States;
11	(6)	Disclosure of similar licensure in any state or
12		territory;
13	(7)	Disclosure of disciplinary action by any state or
14		territory against any license held by the applicant;

16 .	(8)	Any other information the licensing authority may
17		require to investigate the applicant's qualifications
18		for licensure.

21	§ ·	-12 Fees; disposition. (a) Application, examination,

- 3 adopted by the director pursuant to chapter 91.
- 4 (b) Fees assessed shall defray all costs to be incurred by
- 5 the director to support the operation of the genetic counselor
- 6 licensure program.
- 7 § -13 Revocation, suspension, denial, or condition of
- 8 licenses; fines. In addition to any other acts or conditions
- 9 provided by law, the director may refuse to renew, reinstate, or
- 10 restore, or may deny, revoke, suspend, fine, or condition in any
- 11 manner any license for any one or more of the following acts or
- 12 conditions on the part of the applicant or licensed genetic
- 13 counselor:
- 14 (1) Conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction of a
- crime that the director has determined to be of a
- nature that renders the individual convicted unfit to
- 17 practice genetic counseling;
- 18 (2) Failure to report in writing to the director any
- disciplinary decision or rejection of license
- 20 application or renewal related to genetic practice
- 21 issued against the licensed genetic counselor or the
- applicant in any jurisdiction within thirty days of

1		the discipilitary decision of within twenty days of
2		licensure;
3	(3)	Violation of recognized ethical standards for genetic
4		counselors as set by the National Society of Genetic
5		Counselors;
6	(4)	Use of fraud, deception, or misrepresentation in
7		obtaining a license;
8	(5)	Revocation, suspension, or other disciplinary action
9		by another state, territory, federal agency, or
10		country against the licensed genetic counselor or
11		applicant for any reason provided under this section;
12		or
13	(6)	Other just and sufficient cause that renders an
14		individual unfit to practice genetic counseling.
15	§ .	-14 Hearings; appeals. The director will establish a
16	hearing an	nd appeals process for persons who wish to appeal their
17	revocation	n, suspension, denial, or condition of license.
18	§ ·	-15 Prohibited acts; penalties. (a) No individual
19	shall:	
20	(1)	Use in connection with the person's name any
21		designation tending to imply that the individual is a

1		licensed genetic counselor unless the individual is
2		duly licensed and authorized under this chapter; or
3	(2)	Make a representation that the individual is a
4		licensed genetic counselor during the time the
5		person's license issued under this chapter is
6		forfeited, inactive, terminated, suspended, or
7		revoked.
8	(b)	Any individual who violates this section shall be
9	subject t	o a fine of not more than \$1,000 and each day's
10	violation	shall be deemed a separate offense."
