A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR SUBSTANCE ABUSE ASSESSMENTS FOR UNINSURED STUDENTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The department of education has instituted a 2 zero tolerance policy with regard to students who possess, sell, 3 consume, or use intoxicating liquor or illegal drugs while 4 attending school, or who reasonably appear to have consumed or 5 used intoxicating liquor or illegal drugs prior to attending 6 department-supervised activities held on or off school property. 7 Any student found to be in violation of either provision of this 8 policy is subject to the department's disciplinary rules. The 9 student may be allowed to return to school earlier than the 10 department's original disciplinary determination if the student 11 gives the school evidence of: (a) a completed substance abuse 12 assessment and the student is progressing toward clinical 13 discharge from any substance abuse treatment or substance abuse 14 counseling recommended by the substance abuse assessment, or (b) 15 if the substance abuse assessment finds that the student does 16 not need substance abuse treatment or substance abuse 17 counseling, that the student provides a certified copy of the

- 1 assessment, and the student's parent or legal guardian consents
- 2 to the student receiving follow-up counseling or other student
- 3 support services to be provided by the department.
- 4 As used in this section, assessment is the process of
- 5 evaluating or appraising a candidate's suitability for substance
- 6 abuse treatment and placement in a specific treatment modality
- 7 or setting. This evaluation includes information on current and
- 8 past use and abuse of drugs; justice system involvement;
- 9 medical, familial, social, educational, military, employment,
- 10 and treatment histories; and risk of infectious diseases (e.g.,
- 11 sexually transmitted diseases, tuberculosis, HIV/AIDS, and
- 12 hepatitis). Publicly-funded assessment services are needed for
- 13 students who lack the necessary financial resources to obtain
- 14 them, or who are uninsured.
- The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to
- 16 establish an "assessment bank" to cover the cost of substance
- 17 abuse assessments for uninsured students who are found to be in
- 18 violation of the department of education's zero tolerance policy
- 19 relating to alcohol and other drugs.
- 20 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000, or so much
- 22 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for an

- 1 "assessment bank" to cover the cost of substance abuse
- 2 assessments for students who are found to be in violation of the
- 3 department of education's "zero tolerance" policy relating to
- 4 alcohol and other drugs.
- 5 SECTION 3. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
- 6 department of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
