A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AMBULANCE SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the provision of emergency ambulance service is critical for the health and well 2 being of all the residents of the State. The legislature also 3 finds that, although call volumes for emergency ambulance 4 service have increased annually, more than half of all calls are 5 for non-emergency service. This is unfair and subjects those 6 patients who truly have an emergency situation to unnecessary 7 waits for an ambulance to arrive. The legislature further finds 8 that many people, as well as hotels, use ambulance services as a 9 type of free mobile clinic. Many emergency ambulance calls are 10 made to shift liability from a hotel to the ambulance provider 11 because the ambulance provider must take responsibility for a 12 patient's condition after examining the patient, even if only to 13 put on a band-aid or inform a patient that the person has a 14 cold. Hawaii is one of very few states that do not charge for 15 emergency ambulance service response when a patient is not 16 17 transported to an emergency room for emergency care.
- 18 Consequently, this leaves the State's emergency response system



- vulnerable to the abuse by individuals and entities who take 1
- unfair advantage of these full services, while the ambulance 2
- providers incur added fuel, insurance, and supplies costs and 3
- those patients truly in need of emergency ambulance service are 4
- 5 subjected to reduced service.
- The purpose of this Act is to authorize ambulance providers 6
- to charge a fee for non-emergency ambulance service response. 7
- SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8
- amended by adding a new section to part XVIII to be 9
- appropriately designated and to read as follows: 10
- 11 Emergency ambulance service response; fee; when. "§321-
- The director of health may adopt rules in accordance with 12
- chapter 91 to allow emergency ambulance service providers to 13
- charge a fee for an emergency ambulance service response during 14
- which emergency medical services personnel examine a patient who 15
- subsequently is determined not to be in need of transport to an 16
- emergency room for emergency medical care." 17
- SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored. 18
- SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 19
