A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a growingshortage of healthcare professionals in Hawaii, especially on
- 3 the neighbor islands and in rural areas. The State's rapidly
- 4 aging population will significantly increase the demand for
- 5 health care services and long-term care. As the general
- 6 population ages, so does the health care workforce, exacerbating
- 7 the growing shortage of providers. In addition, low
- 8 reimbursement rates, issues related to living and working in
- 9 remote communities, challenging working conditions, and the cost
- 10 of medical malpractice insurance continue to create barriers to
- 11 recruitment and retention of health care providers, especially
- 12 in certain specialty areas.
- Even if people have health insurance, they are often unable
- 14 to access appropriate care. A fully staffed, well-trained
- 15 health care workforce is a key component in providing quality
- 16 healthcare to all Hawaii residents.

1	The purpose of this Act is to develop and maintain a	
2	statewide	comprehensive health care workforce map and database
3	to:	
4	(1)	Compile and analyze existing data on the supply and
5		distribution of all health care practitioners,
6		technicians, and other health care workers by
7		specialty and practice location;
8	(2)	Develop a plan to collect and systematically update
9		data; and
10	(3)	Project and develop a plan to meet future health care
11		workforce needs.
12	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general	
13	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000, or so much	
14	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for the	
15	state health planning and development agency to develop and	
16	maintain a statewide comprehensive health care work force map	
17	and database.	
18	SECTION 3. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the	
19	department of health for the purposes of this Act.	
20	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
