A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the enactment of the Reinventing Education Act in the 2004 regular session and other 2 3 education reform measures represent a positive first step towards improving test scores, teacher retention, and the 4 overall quality of education. While there are many issues to be 5 addressed, the legislature believes that providing the 6 7 department of education with greater autonomy will lead to an improved system of accountability and quality of service. 8 Establishing the department of education as a political 9 subdivision will free the department from impediments that 10 sometimes lead to delays in much needed improvements to the 11 12 public educational system. 13 The constitutional amendments contained in S.B. No. will 14 grant the department of education the autonomy it requires to 15 effectively oversee the educational needs of the State's students and teachers. With that measure, the board of 16

education will be empowered to head the department of education

- 1 as a political subdivision in a manner similar to other .
- 2 political subdivisions of the State.
- 3 It is the intent of the legislature to provide the members
- 4 of the board of education with proper compensation for their
- 5 efforts in running the department of education. Accordingly,
- 6 the purpose of this Act is to provide salaries for board of
- 7 education members and require them to serve on a full-time
- 8 basis.
- 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 11 and to read as follows:
- 12 "\$302A- Salary commission; established. (a) There is
- 13 established a salary commission for the members of the board of
- 14 education. The salary commission shall consist of seven members
- 15 appointed by the governor on or before August 31, 2007, and
- 16 every four years thereafter. The members of the salary
- 17 commission shall be selected from nominations submitted by the
- 18 president of the senate and speaker of the house of
- 19 representatives. The members shall serve without compensation,
- 20 but shall be entitled to reimbursement for necessary expenses
- 21 incurred in the discharge of their duties and responsibilities.

1 (b) Before the twentieth legislative day of the regular 2 session of 2008 and every four years thereafter, the salary commission shall study and make recommendations to the 3 legislature for the salary of the members of the board of 4 5 education. The salary commission shall be dissolved on June 30, 2008, and on June 30 every four years thereafter in which it 6 submits recommendations to the legislature. The recommended 7 8 salary shall be effective as of the date of the recommendation, 9 unless the legislature disapproves the recommendation by 10 adoption of a concurrent resolution prior to adjournment sine die of the legislative session in which the recommendation is 11 12 submitted." SECTION 3. Section 302A-1101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 14 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 15 There shall be a principal executive department to be known as the department of education, which shall be headed by 16 **17** an elected policy-making board to be known as the board of education. Members of the board shall serve on a full-time 18 basis. The board shall have power in accordance with law to 19 20 formulate statewide educational policy, adopt student

3	SECT	ION 4. Section 302A-1105, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended t	o read as follows:
5	"§30	2A-1105 [Compensation;] Salaries; expenses[-];
6	allowance	s. Board of education members shall [be allowed]:
7	[(1)	Compensation at the rate of \$100 per day for each
8		day's actual attendance at meetings;
9	(1)	Receive an annual salary, which shall be paid in equal
10		amounts;
11	(2)	[Transportation] Be allowed transportation fares
12		between islands and abroad; [and]
13	(3)	[Personal] Be allowed personal expenses at the rates
14		specified by the board while attending board meetings
15		or while on official business as authorized by the
16		chairperson, when the board meetings or official
17		business require a board member to leave the island
18		upon which the board member resides[-]; and
19	(4)	Be allowed a protocol allowance to cover expenses
20		incurred in the course of a member's duties and
21		responsibilities."

- 1 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 6. This Act, upon its approval, shall take effect
- 4 on July 1, 2095, and upon the ratification of a constitutional
- 5 amendment that makes the department of education a political
- 6 subdivision headed by the board of education.
