## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO DETERMINE THE FEASIBILITY OF IMPLEMENTING PROCEDURES GOVERNING PLACEMENT OF CHILDREN IN TEMPORARY FOSTER CUSTODY WITH KIN OR NON-KIN FOSTER PARENTS.

WHEREAS, foster custody places a very emotional and sometimes traumatic burden on children in the foster care system; and

WHEREAS, when a child is placed in a foster home, foster parents generally form a bond with the foster child, yet many foster children long to seek out their kin; and

WHEREAS, foster care is a very complex issue because many emotions for everyone are involved, and each situation is different, making the decision to place a child in a home a difficult one for social workers; and

WHEREAS, the best interests of a child should be paramount in determining the placement of a child in foster custody; and

WHEREAS, the House of Representatives' Committee on Human Services held a public hearing to discuss H.B. No. 1856, regarding the issue of placing a child with kin or non-kin foster caregivers; and

WHEREAS, compelling testimony was received with many viewpoints, all of which were valid and worthy of further discussion; and

WHEREAS, because many issues remain unresolved and difficult to determine because of the complexities and unique circumstances of each child's situation, more discussions with various stakeholders need to take place; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2006, the

House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 1 Human Services (DHS) is requested to convene a working group to 2 determine the feasibility of implementing procedures for placing a child in temporary foster custody with kin or non-kin foster 5 parents, including the possibility of a committee to make decisions on a case-by-case basis; and 6 7 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 9 to discuss, among other things: 10 11 (1)Defining "attachment" as it pertains to the relationship between a foster child and a caregiver, 12 and how attachment can be considered when determining 13 placement of a child; 14 15 16 (2) Determining circumstances under which siblings may be separated, and finding solutions to keep siblings 17 together whenever possible; 18 19 Determining the length of time children should remain (3) 20 in the foster care system and finding solutions to 21 minimize their time in the system, without 22 jeopardizing the children's health or welfare; and 23 24 (4) 25 Determining whether changes are needed to improve the 26 present model of foster placement, or whether the 27 methods of foster placement require further review and 28 analysis; 29
