A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING EMERGENCY APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE DIVISION OF CONSUMER ADVOCACY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for
- 2 immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 3 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.
- 4 SECTION 2. The purpose of this Act is to provide emergency
- 5 appropriations for the division of consumer advocacy of the
- 6 department of commerce and consumer affairs to investigate the
- 7 power outages that occurred on October 15, 2006, on the islands
- 8 of Oahu, Maui, and Hawaii.
- 9 The legislature finds and declares that the appropriations
- 10 under this Act are in the public interest and are necessary for
- 11 the protection of the consumers of electric services in the
- 12 State.
- SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the public
- 14 utilities commission special fund the sum of \$100,000 for fiscal
- 15 year 2006-2007 to be deposited into the compliance resolution
- 16 fund.

- 1 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the compliance
- 2 resolution fund the sum of \$100,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 3 necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007 to investigate the power
- 4 outages that occurred on October 15, 2006, on the islands of
- 5 Oahu, Maui, and Hawaii.
- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 7 commerce and consumer affairs for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 5. The division of consumer advocacy shall submit
- 9 a report to the legislature no later than twenty days before the
- 10 convening of the regular session of 2008 providing:
- 11 (1) The date of each expenditure;
- 12 (2) The identity of any recipient of payments for each
- expenditure; and
- 14 (3) The scope of the consultant contract for which each
- expenditure was provided.
- 16 SECTION 6. Any provision of this Act to the contrary
- 17 notwithstanding, the appropriations authorized under this Act
- 18 shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year for which the
- 19 appropriation was made. All unexpended and unencumbered
- 20 balances of the appropriations made in this Act as of the close
- 21 of business on June 30, 2008, shall lapse.
- 22 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
