### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BUILDING CODES.

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#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State has 2 traditionally allowed the individual counties to establish their own building codes. The counties have adopted various portions 3 4 of the Uniform Building Code, but the code differs from county to county. The status of fragmented building requirements in 5 Hawaii is of serious concern to those involved in building 6 7 ownership, design, construction, and insurance. Over forty 8 states have adopted some form of a statewide building code.

9 The adoption of a uniform set of statewide building codes 10 applicable to one and two family dwellings, all other residential uses, and commercial and industrial buildings, and 11 state buildings would make it possible for building owners, 12 13 designers, contractors, and code enforcers within the State to apply consistent standards. The International Building Code is 14 15 currently being considered for adoption by all counties. The 16 health and safety considerations related to the codes are of



statewide interest, especially relating to emergency disaster
 preparedness.

3 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
4 accounting and general services to establish and implement a
5 state building code.

6 SECTION 2. Chapter 107, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
8 to read as follows:

9 "PART II. STATE BUILDING CODE AND DESIGN STANDARDS
10 §107-A Definitions. As used in this part:

11 "Council" means the state building code council.

"Department" means the department of accounting and general 13 services.

14 "Hurricane resistive criteria" means the design criteria 15 for enhanced hurricane protection areas that are capable of 16 withstanding a five hundred-year hurricane event, as developed 17 by the state department of defense for public shelter and 18 residential safe room design criteria.

19 "State building construction" means any building
20 construction project or program initiated by a state agency or
21 requiring the use of state funds.

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1	§107	-B State building code council. (a) There is
2	establisł	ned a state building code council. The council shall be
3	placed wi	thin the department of accounting and general services
4	for admin	istrative purposes only. The council shall consist of
5	nine voti	ng members and one nonvoting member, who shall be the
6	comptrol1	er or the comptroller's designee. The council members
7	shall ser	ve four-year terms as defined in paragraphs (1) to (6).
8	The votin	g members shall include:
9	-(1)	One county building official from each of the four
10		counties appointed by the mayor;
11	(2)	One member representing the state fire council;
12	(3)	One member representing the department of health who
13		has significant experience in building mechanical and
14		sewage disposal systems;
15	(4)	One member representing the department of labor and
16		industrial relations who has significant experience in
17		elevator or fire safety;
18	(5)	One member representing the Structural Engineers
19		Association of Hawaii; and
20	(6)	One member representing the American Institute of

20 (6) One member representing the American Institute of
21 Architects, Hawaii State Council.

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(b) Six voting members shall constitute a quorum. The
 chairperson of the council shall be elected annually from among
 its members by a majority vote of the members of the council.

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4 (c) Members shall serve without compensation, but shall be
5 reimbursed for expenses, including travel expenses necessary for
6 the performance of their duties.

\$107-C Executive director and executive assistant. The 7 8 council shall appoint, exempt from chapters 76 and 89, an executive director, who shall serve at the pleasure of the 9 10 council, and who shall have administrative abilities and expertise in engineering or architecture. The council shall 11 12 also appoint, exempt from chapters 76 and 89, an executive assistant, who shall have experience in statutory and 13 administrative rulemaking processes. 14

15 §107-D Authority and duties of the council. (a) Any law
16 to the contrary notwithstanding, the council shall establish a
17 comprehensive state building code.

(b) The council shall appoint a subcommittee comprised of
the four council members representing county building officials,
whose duty shall be to recommend any necessary or desirable
state amendments to the model codes. Any recommended state



amendments shall require the unanimous agreement of the
 subcommittee.

3 (c) The council may appoint other investigative, technical
4 expertise committees, which may include council members.

5 (d) The council shall consult with general building
6 contractor associations and building trade associations to
7 gather information and recommendations on construction practices
8 and training relevant to building codes and standards.

9 (e) The council shall review and adopt, as appropriate,
10 new model building codes within eighteen months of the official
11 publication date.

12 (f) The council may make expenditures for technical
13 references, equipment and supplies, and other operating
14 expenses, and may contract for the conduct of research studies
15 and other technical services.

(g) The council shall provide education and technical training and administrative assistance in the form of services or grants at the state and county levels relating to the implementation and enforcement of the state building code adopted pursuant to this part.



1	§107	-E State building code; requirements. There is
2	establish	ned a state building code applicable to all construction
3	in the St	ate of Hawaii. The state building code shall include:
4	(1)	The latest edition of the state fire code as adopted
5		by the state fire council;
6	(2)	The latest edition of the Uniform Plumbing Code, as
7		copyrighted and published by the International
8		Association of Plumbing and Mechanical Officials,
9		including its appendices;
10	(3)	The latest edition of the International Building Code,
11		as published by the International Code Council;
12	(4)	Hawaii design standards implementing the criteria
13		pursuant to Act 5, Special Session Laws of Hawaii,
14		2005, as applicable to:
15		(A) Emergency shelters built to comply with hurricane
16		resistant criteria, including enhanced hurricane
17		protection areas capable of withstanding a five
18		hundred year hurricane event as well as other
19		storms and natural hazards; and
20		(B) Essential government facilities requiring
21		continuity of operations; and



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1	(5)	Code provisions based on nationally published codes or
2		standards that include, but are not limited to,
3		residential and hurricane resistive standards for
4		residential construction, fire, elevator, electrical,
5		plumbing, mechanical, flood and tsunami, existing
6		buildings, and energy conservation standards for
7		building design and construction, and onsite sewage
8		disposal.
9	§107-	-F State building code; prohibitions. In adopting a
10	state buil	lding code, the council shall not adopt provisions
11	that:	
12	(1)	Relate to administrative, permitting, or enforcement
13		and inspection procedures of each county; or
14	(2)	Conflict with chapter 464.
15	§107-	<b>G Exemptions.</b> (a) Upon adoption of rules under this
16	chapter, t	he design of all state building construction shall be
17	in complia	nce with the state building code within one year of
18	its effect	ive date, and state building construction shall be
19	allowed to	be exempted from:
20	(1)	County codes that have not adopted the state building

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code;




(2) Any county code amendments that are inconsistent with
 the minimum performance objectives of the state
 building code or the objectives enumerated in this
 part; or

5 (3) Any county code amendments that are contrary to code
6 amendments adopted by another county.

7 (b) Exemptions shall include county ordinances allowing
8 the exercise of indigenous Hawaiian architecture adopted in
9 accordance with section 46-1.55.

\$107-H County building code authority to amend the state 10 model building code without state approval. (a) The governing 11 body of each county shall amend the state building code as it 12 applies within its respective jurisdiction, in accordance with 13 section 46-1.5(13), without approval of the council. Each 14 county shall use the model codes and standards listed in section 15 107-E, as the referenced model building codes and standards for 16 its respective county building code ordinance, no later than two 17 vears after the adoption of the state building code. 18

(b) If a county does not amend the statewide model code
within the two-year timeframe, the state building code shall
become applicable as an interim county building code until the
county adopts the amendments.



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1	<b>§107-I Rules.</b> The department shall adopt rules pursuant			
2	to chapter 91 necessary for the purposes of this part.			
3	§107-J Annual report. The department shall report to the			
4	legislature, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of			
5	each regular legislative session, on the council's activities			
6	and accomplishments.			
7	<b>§107-K State building code; compliance.</b> The design of all			
8	state building construction shall be in compliance with the			
9	state building code within one year of its effective date."			
10	SECTION 3. Chapter 107, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
11	amended by designating sections 107-1 to 107-11 as part I,			
12	entitled:			
13	"PART I. GENERAL PROVISIONS"			
14	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the interest			
15	earned from the principal in the Hawaii hurricane relief fund,			
16	the sum of \$250,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for			
17	fiscal year 2007-2008 and the same sum, or so much thereof as			
18	may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the operations of			
19	the state building code council, including technical assistance			
20	services, and training and administrative assistance as			
21	required.			

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1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department of accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act. 2 3 SECTION 5. In codifying the new sections added by section 4 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating 5 6 the new sections in this Act. 7 SECTION 6. This Act does not affect rights and duties that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 8 9 begun, before its effective date.

10 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
