A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL PROPERTY DAMAGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

11	(a)	The person recklessly damages the property of another,
12		without the other's consent, by the use of widely
13	¥	dangerous means;
14	(b)	The person intentionally or knowingly damages the
15		property of another, without the other's consent, in
16		an amount exceeding \$500; or
17	(c)	The person intentionally damages the agricultural
18		equipment, supplies, or products or aquacultural
19		equipment, supplies, or products of another, including
20		trees, bushes, or any other plant and livestock of
21		another, without the other's consent, in an amount
22		exceeding \$100. In calculating the [value of damage,

1	the value of future crops that were damaged is
2	included. amount of damages to agricultural products,
3	the amount of damages includes future losses and the
4	loss of future production."
5	SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
6	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
7	begun, before its effective date.
8	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
9	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
10	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
