A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROSTITUTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 712-1200, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "\$712-1200 Prostitution. (1) A person commits the offense of prostitution if the person engages in, or agrees or 4 5 offers to engage in, sexual conduct with another person for a 6 fee $[\cdot]$ in a public place that is likely to be observed by others 7 who would be affronted or alarmed. For purposes of this 8 section, a "public place" means any street, sidewalk, bridge, 9 alley or alleyway, plaza, driveway, parking lot, or 10 transportation facility, or the doorways and entrance ways to 11 any building that fronts on any of these places, or a motor 12 vehicle in or on any such place except areas that are designated as exceptions to this section pursuant to subsection (6). 13 14 (2) As used in subsection (1), "sexual conduct" means 15 "sexual penetration," "deviate sexual intercourse," or "sexual 16 contact," as those terms are defined in section 707-700.
- 17 (3) Prostitution is a [petty-misdemeanor.] violation,

 18 subject to a fine of up to \$500.



1	[- (4) -	A person convicted of committing the offense of
2	prostitut	ion shall be sentenced as follows:
3	(a)	For the first offense, when the court has not deferred
4		further proceedings pursuant to chapter 853, a
5		mandatory fine of \$500 and the person may be sentenced
6		to a term of imprisonment of not more than thirty days
7		or probation; provided that in the event the convicted
8		person defaults in payment of the \$500 fine, and the
9		default was not contumacious, the court may sentence
10		the person to perform services for the community as
11		authorized by section 706-605(1).
12	-(b)-	For any subsequent offense, a mandatory fine of \$500
13		and a term of imprisonment of thirty days or
14		probation, without possibility of deferral of further
15		proceedings pursuant to chapter 853 and without
16		possibility of suspension of sentence.
17	(c)	For the purpose of this subsection, if the court has
18		deferred further proceedings pursuant to chapter 853,
19		and notwithstanding any provision of chapter 853 to
20		the contrary, the defendant shall not be eligible to
21		apply for expungement pursuant to section 831-3.2
22		until four years following discharge. A plea

2	for a violation of this section shall be considered a
3	prior offense. When the court has ordered a sentence
4	of probation, the court may impose as a condition of
5	probation that the defendant complete a course of
6	prostitution intervention classes; provided that the
7	court may only impose such condition for one term of
8	<pre>probation.</pre>
9	(4) There shall be no penalty for engaging in, or agreeing
10	or offering to engage in, acts of prostitution except as
11	described in subsection (1) above.
12	(5) This section shall not apply to any member of a police
13	department, a sheriff, or a law enforcement officer acting in
14	the course and scope of duties.
15	(6) The legislature and counties shall designate areas
16	within their jurisdiction as exempt from the penalty provisions
17	of subsection (3). Designated areas shall include portions of
18	geographic areas that have a history of this offense. The
19	designated areas may be described both by geographic boundaries
20	and by time of day limitations."

1 property owned or under the jurisdiction of any governmental 2 entity or otherwise open to the public. 3 "Sexual conduct" has the same meaning as in section 712-4 $\frac{1200(2)}{.}$ 5 "Waikiki" means that area of Oahu bounded by the Ala Wai 6 canal, the ocean, and Kapahulu avenue. 7 (9) This section shall apply to all counties; provided 8 that if a county enacts an ordinance to regulate street 9 solicitation for prostitution, other than an ordinance 10 designating an area as a zone of significant prostitution-11 related activity, the county ordinance shall supersede this 12 section and no person shall be convicted under this section in 13 that county."] 14 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 16 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 17

Description:

Decriminalizes the offense of prostitution. Makes prostitution a violation only if it is committed in a public place.
