HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO SUPPORT PASSAGE OF THE NATIONAL GUARD EMPOWERMENT ACT OF 2007.

WHEREAS, there is a long-standing history of National Guard 1 leaders not being consulted beforehand concerning strategic 2 force structure and budgetary policies; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, there is clear agreement that a strong National Guard to address crises and emergencies, both foreign and 6 domestic, is vital to the interests of the United States; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, S.430, the National Guard Empowerment Act of 2007, was introduced in the United States Senate and is designed to 10 make the National Guard a stronger and more responsible defense 11 agency that will improve the nation's defense and improve the 12 military's ability to support civilian authorities during 13 domestic emergencies; and 14 15 WHEREAS, an identical bill, H.R. 718, was introduced in the 16 United States House of Representatives; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, the bills call for elevating the Chief of the National Guard to the rank of full general and making that 20 officer a member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the bills will require the National Guard to work 23 with the states to identify gaps between federal and state 24 capabilities in responding to emergencies and further grants the 25 National Guard the authority to set equipment requirements and 26 procure equipment for this domestically oriented mission; now, 27 28 therefore. 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 30 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 31 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the United States 32 HCR LRB 07-3338.doc
