HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO ADOPT ADMINISTRATIVE RULES TO ALLOW THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO GRANT SCHOOL CREDIT TO THE STUDENT MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

WHEREAS, a representative democracy is dependent on a 1 citizenry that is informed, prepared, willing, and capable of 2 3 actively participating in government; and 4 WHEREAS, participation in a representative democracy is a 5 6 learned behavior; and 7 WHEREAS, for decades, people have become increasingly 8 disengaged from the civic and political institutions of our 9 10 country, behavior that results from experiences starting at a 11 young age; and 12 13 WHEREAS, youth participation appears to be increasing in the areas of volunteerism, community service, and religious 14 activity, but youth awareness of social issues has decreased due 15 to fewer opportunities for political discussions and a weaker 16 17 connection between youth and the community; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the Legislature believes that schools have a mission to "advance the endowment of human nature itself, so 20 that each succeeding generation finds itself further along the 21 road towards peace, social justice, and environmental 22 23 sustainability in a society guided by creativity, compassion, 24 and curiosity," as expressed in the Reinventing Education Act of 25 2004, Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004; and 26 WHEREAS, the Legislature supports the Department of 27 Education's efforts to promote academic achievement, civic 28 responsibility, and holistic development in its students; and 29



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1 WHEREAS, only a few high schools have integrated civic learning into their curriculum; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, the youth of Hawaii have demonstrated a desire to 5 be engaged and connected with their community and the world around them beyond what academic disciplines can offer; and 6 7 WHEREAS, participation on non-profit boards is a form of 8 9 community service and political engagement that helps students develop the attitudes, skills, and abilities that may not be 10 learned through the academic disciplines or curricular programs; 11 and 12 13 WHEREAS, students who participate on non-profit boards can 14 15 develop the skills, conduct, and attitudes needed to collaborate, build consensus, and work toward common goals with 16 17 others, which are skills essential to supporting and sustaining a vibrant representative democracy and a society guided by the 18 principles of productivity and interdependency; and 19 20 WHEREAS, students who participate on the Board of Education 21 while simultaneously pursuing academic goals in school, can also 22 learn the value of service to their peers, schools, and the 23 24 Department of Education; and 25 26 WHEREAS, by participating on the Board of Education, 27 students may have to miss classes to attend meetings; now, 28 therefore, 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 30 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 31 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Board of 32 Education is urged to adopt administrative rules to allow the 33 Department of Education to grant elective school credit to the 34 35 student member of the Board of Education; and 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature requests that 37 any elective school credit granted apply toward the student's 38 graduation requirements; and 39

Board of Education and the Superintendent of Education.
