
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING STATE AND COUNTY AGENCIES TO ACCOUNT FOR SEA-LEVEL RISE
AND MINIMIZE RISKS FROM COASTAL HAZARDS.

1 WHEREAS, sea-level rise is well documented in the Hawaiian
2 Islands because historical tide gauge data provides clear
3 evidence of long-term change in mean sea-level at all record
4 keeping locations statewide; and

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6 WHEREAS, the Brunn Rule provides a generic ratio for sea-
7 level rise to shoreline retreat with average values of one inch
8 of rise to one hundred inches of retreat for sandy shorelines;
9 and

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11 WHEREAS, exposure to coastal hazards is directly related to
12 proximity to the shoreline, and preparing for the migration of
13 hazards requires understanding the rate of sea-level rise and
14 localized erosion rates; and

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16 WHEREAS, current shoreline setback requirements have been
17 established without adequate data on historical shoreline
18 positions and trends, which has resulted in designating high
19 wave and flood zones closer to developed areas, and increasing
20 the risk of exposure to and damage from storms, hurricanes, or
21 tsunamis for these areas; and

23 WHEREAS, there has been widespread construction of shore
24 protections projects structures such as seawalls and revetments
25 because chronically retreating shorelines eventually threaten
26 these improvements; and

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28 WHEREAS, it is important that information regarding natural
29 hazards such as coastal erosion data be incorporated into the
30 planning and permitting processes at the earliest stages of
31 development; and

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1 WHEREAS, state and county agencies that are responsible for
2 land use planning and permitting need to be more diligent when
3 reviewing and processing land use entitlements in the shoreline
4 area; now, therefore,

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6 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
7 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
8 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that state and county
9 agencies are urged to account for sea-level rise and minimize
10 risks from coastal hazards such as erosion, storm inundation,
11 hurricanes, and tsunamis; and

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13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and
14 Natural Resources establish a task force that includes the
15 following members or the member's designee:

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17 (1) The Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural
18 Resources;
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20 (2) The Director of the Office of Planning;
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22 (3) The Director of the City and County of Honolulu
23 Department of Planning and Permitting;
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25 (4) The Department Head of the County of Hawaii Planning
26 Department;
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28 (5) The Planning Director of the County of Maui Department
29 of Planning; and
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31 (6) The Director of the County of Kauai Planning
32 Department; and

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34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and
35 Natural Resources will form the task force to:

37 (1) Investigate and identify best practices to mitigate
38 coastal hazards;

40 (2) Identify and adopt best practices for state and county
41 agencies to plan for coastal hazards such as erosion,
42 sea-level rise, storm inundation, hurricanes, and
43 tsunamis by considering future movements of the
44 shoreline that can threaten structures;



- 1 (3) Investigate, study, and acquire erosion data from each
- 2 county;
- 3
- 4 (4) Identify any alternate procedures or methods to
- 5 determine average annual shoreline erosion rates for
- 6 individual shoreline locations statewide;
- 7
- 8 (5) Identify and adopt best practices to consider average
- 9 annual erosion rates before zoning, community
- 10 planning, and subdivision changes are made; and
- 11
- 12 (6) Identify and adopt best practices to incorporate
- 13 information regarding natural hazards such as coastal
- 14 erosion data into the planning and permitting
- 15 processes of each state and county agency responsible
- 16 for land use planning and permitting at the earliest
- 17 stages of development; and

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and
 20 Natural Resources submit a written report to the Legislature of
 21 the task force's findings and recommendation, including any
 22 proposed legislation, no later than twenty days prior to the
 23 convening of the 2008 Regular Session; and

 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
 26 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the
 27 Office of Planning; the Chairperson of the Board of Land and
 28 Natural Resources; the Mayor, City and County of Honolulu; the
 29 Mayor, County of Hawaii; the Mayor, County of Maui; the Mayor,
 30 County of Kauai; the Director of the Planning and Permitting
 31 Department, City and County of Honolulu; Department Head of the
 32 Planning Department, County of Hawaii; the Planning Director of
 33 the Department of Planning, County of Maui; and the Director of
 34 the Planning Department, County of Kauai.
