# HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII STATE COUNCIL OF THE AMERICAN INSTITUTE OF ARCHITECTS TO PROMOTE AWARENESS OF FAMILY CAREGIVING NEEDS IN THE DESIGN OF NEW RESIDENCES.

1 WHEREAS, family caregiving has always been a universal  
2 experience of all ethnicities, lifestyles, and income levels;  
3 and

5 WHEREAS, due to a shortage of care providers in Hawaii,  
6 family caregiving has become a critical element of our health  
7 and long-term care system; and  
8

9 WHEREAS, the need for personal care assistance due to  
10 physical, sensory, cognitive, and self-care disabilities  
11 increases with age; and  
12

13 WHEREAS, by 2020, more than one in four individuals are  
14 expected to be sixty years of age or older; and  
15

16 WHEREAS, as Hawaii's population ages, many more families  
17 will be providing higher levels of long-term care to frail and  
18 disabled older adults at home; and  
19

20 WHEREAS, the design of a residence can enhance or impede  
21 the independence and mobility of its occupants as they age; and

23 WHEREAS, the design of a residence can also enhance or  
24 impede a family caregiver's capacity to provide assistance to  
25 frail and disabled older adults at home; and

27 WHEREAS, the National Academy of Science has recommended  
28 that professional training in architecture include information  
29 on the range of capabilities and limitations of the aging  
30 population so that these factors can be incorporated into  
31 designs; and



1           WHEREAS, certain physical attributes of housing can support  
2 therapeutic activities and aging-in-place, such as the basic  
3 partitioning of the building; and  
4

5           WHEREAS, the Hawaii State Council of the American Institute  
6 of Architects should promote awareness of family caregiving  
7 needs in the design of new residences; now, therefore,  
8

9           BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
10 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular  
11 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Hawaii State  
12 Council of the American Institute of Architects is requested to  
13 promote awareness of family caregiving needs in the design of  
14 new residences; and

16           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
17 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the  
18 Hawaii State Council of the American Institute of Architects;  
19 and the Dean of the University of Hawaii at Manoa, School of  
20 Architecture.
