
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE ADOPTION OF THE UNITED NATIONS' CONVENTION ON THE
RIGHTS OF THE CHILD.

1 WHEREAS, in Hawaiian culture, the family is of central
2 importance as expressed by the concept of ohana, and the
3 responsibilities and privileges of parenting, guardianship, and
4 advocacy for children are opportunities to enable a child's life
5 to be meaningful; and
6

7 WHEREAS, in Hawaii, the sustainability of the culture of
8 ohana is dependent upon making a child's safety and well-being
9 the highest priorities; and
10

11 WHEREAS, the principles of the Charter of the United
12 Nations affirm that the recognition of the inherent dignity and
13 the equal and inalienable rights of all members of the human
14 family is the foundation of freedom, justice, and peace in the
15 world; and

17 WHEREAS, the United Nations, in the Universal Declaration
18 of Human Rights and the International Covenants on Human Rights,
19 has affirmed that everyone is entitled to all the rights and
20 freedoms set forth therein, without regard to race, color, sex,
21 language, religion, political or other opinion, national or
22 social origin, property, or birth; and

24 WHEREAS, the United Nations, in the Universal Declaration
25 of Human Rights, has proclaimed that each child is entitled to
26 special care and assistance; and



1 WHEREAS, the family, as the fundamental unit of society and
2 the natural environment for the growth and well-being of all its
3 members and particularly children, should be afforded the
4 necessary protection and assistance so that it can fully assume
5 its responsibilities within the community; and

6
7 WHEREAS, each child, for the full and harmonious
8 development of the child's personality, should grow up in a
9 family environment, in an atmosphere of happiness, love, and
10 understanding; and

11
12 WHEREAS, to be fully prepared to participate as a member of
13 society, each child needs to be brought up in the spirit of the
14 ideals of the United Nations Charter, especially in the spirit
15 of peace, dignity, tolerance, freedom, equality, and solidarity;
16 and

18 WHEREAS, on November 20, 1989, the United Nations General
19 Assembly adopted the Convention of the Rights of the Child; and

20
21 WHEREAS, 192 nations have entered as signatories to the
22 Convention of the Rights of the Child; and

23
24 WHEREAS, the preamble to the State of Hawaii Constitution
25 proclaims that the State of Hawaii is dedicated to the
26 fulfillment of the State motto, "Ua mau ke ea o ka aina i ka
27 pono," meaning, "The life of the land is perpetuated in
28 righteousness"; and

30 WHEREAS, to protect, nurture, and care for our keiki is an
31 underlying principle for Hawaii as a Pacific Island community;
32 and

34 WHEREAS, 13 percent of all Hawaii's children live in
35 poverty; and

37 WHEREAS, 21 percent of the homeless are children age nine
38 or younger, and one out of three are age 17 or younger; and

40 WHEREAS, the Convention on the Rights of the Child
41 contributes to awareness of the problems of children in Hawaii
42 and around the world; now, therefore,



1 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
2 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
3 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature
4 urges the State of Hawaii to adopt the United Nations'
5 Convention on the Rights of the Child; and

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature urges the
8 President to request that Congress ratify the Convention on the
9 Rights of the Child; and

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
12 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the
13 United States, the Governor, Attorney General, Director of
14 Finance, Superintendent of Education, Director of Health,
15 Director of Human Services, Director of Public Safety, and the
16 Chairperson of the Board of Regents of the University of Hawaii.
