HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO CONDUCT A STUDY OF THE HAWAIIAN EDUCATION PROGRAM.

1 WHEREAS, the Hawaiian education program, mandated by the 2 Constitution of the State of Hawaii, article X, section 4, has 3 been implemented in public elementary schools as Hawaiian 4 studies and language programs to assist students to learn, 5 understand, and appreciate Hawaiian language, culture, and 6 history; and 7

8 WHEREAS, the Hawaiian education program utilizes a kupuna
9 (elder) component, which consists of a community resource person
10 who has expertise in Hawaii's cultural heritage and assists
11 classroom teachers in the delivery of program instruction; and

13 WHEREAS, the Hawaiian education program is a viable part of 14 the perpetuation of the native Hawaiian language and culture, 15 and the Board of Education's support for the program is an 16 integral part of the Hawaii content and performance standards; 17 and

19 WHEREAS, many schools do not provide the Hawaiian education 20 program in all grade levels, the program curriculum has become 21 outdated and now requires the support and assistance of the 22 Department of Education; and

24 WHEREAS, a review of the Hawaiian education program would 25 assist the Department of Education in maintaining the quality 26 and consistency of delivery of the program; now, therefore 27

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to conduct a study of the Department of Education's Hawaiian education program, implemented as Hawaiian studies and language programs, to identify concerns and issues regarding the delivery and implementation of the program; and

23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, for improving the Hawaiian studies and language program not later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2008; and
