## ACT 011 H.B. NO. 1158

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ARSON.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 706-606.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: "[+]§706-606.2[+] Special sentencing considerations for 3 arson; other actions not prohibited. In addition to any other 4 penalty imposed, a person convicted of arson involving fire set 5 6 to brush, grass, vegetation on the land resulting in damage to [10,000] ten thousand square feet or more of property, may be 7 8 required to: Pay any costs associated with extinguishing the fire; 9 10 and 11 Perform community service work in the region in which (b) 12 the property damage occurred. With regard to any [+] fine[+] or monetary penalty that may be 13 imposed on a minor convicted or adjudicated for an offense of 14 arson, the parents or legal guardians of the minor shall be 15 liable for the percentage of costs associated with extinguishing 16 the fire based upon the apportionment of fire damage to real or 17

personal property caused by the minor as a result of committing

- 1 the offense of arson, regardless of whether the property is
- 2 publicly or privately owned.
- 3 Nothing in this section shall prohibit a separate criminal
- 4 action being brought by the State or a civil action being
- 5 brought by the State or a third party for conduct that
- 6 constitutes an offense of arson."
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 708-8254, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows:
- 9 "(1) A person commits the offense of arson in the fourth
- 10 degree if the person intentionally [or], knowingly, or
- 11 recklessly sets fire to, or causes to be burned property and
- 12 thereby damages the property of another without the other's
- 13 consent."
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 15 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 16 begun, before its effective date.
- 17 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 19 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
