## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILDREN.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that children,
- 2 particularly young children, are the most vulnerable during, and
- 3 at times victimized by, homelessness. While many children
- 4 develop some resiliency to their situation and are able to
- 5 overcome the ravages of homelessness, homelessness often leads
- 6 to poor health, exposure to violence, poor academic performance,
- 7 and a lack of positive social interactions.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to minimize the adverse effects
- 9 of homelessness on children by establishing a task force to
- 10 coordinate resources to benefit children who are homeless.
- 11 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a task force to
- 12 coordinate public and private resources to benefit homeless
- 13 children.
- 14 (b) The president of the senate and the speaker of the
- 15 house of representatives shall convene the task force. The task
- 16 force shall:

1	(1)	Be c	co-chaired by the chair of the senate human
2		serv	rices and public housing committee and the chair of
3		the	house human services and housing committee; and
4	(2)	Incl	ude:
5		(A)	The superintendent of education or the
6			superintendent of education's designee;
7		(B)	The director of health or the director of
8			health's designee;
9		(C)	The director of human services or the director of
10			human services' designee;
11		(D)	Four members representing the four counties
12			appointed by the mayor of each county;
13		(E)	Four members representing not-for-profit
14			organizations that serve Hawaii's homeless
15			families, two appointed by the president of the
16			senate and two appointed by the speaker of the
17			house of representatives;
18		(F)	The chairs of the senate and house education
19			committees;
20		(G)	The chairs of the senate and house health
21			committees; and

1		(H)	Two individuals who are homeless, one appointed
2			by the president of the senate and one appointed
3			by the speaker of the house of representatives.
4	(c)	The	task force shall establish findings and develop

- for the task force shall establish findings and develop recommendations on how the State can coordinate public and private resources to benefit homeless children.
- 7 (d) The task force shall submit an interim report,
- 8 including any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later
- 9 than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session
- 10 of 2008, 2009, and 2010, and shall submit a final report,
- 11 including its findings and recommendations and any proposed
- 12 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
- 13 to the convening of the regular session of 2011.
- 14 (e) The task force shall terminate on June 30, 2011.
- 15 SECTION 3. (a) There is established within the state
- 16 treasury the kokua na keiki special fund to be administered and
- 17 expended by the department of human services, and into which
- 18 shall be deposited:
- 19 (1) Appropriations made by the legislature; and
- 20 (2) Any contributions by private entities.
- 21 (b) The moneys in the special fund shall be used by the
- 22 department of human services to:

1	(T)	Establish and hire a nomelessness coordinator
2		position; and
3	(2)	Establish and hire one support staff position to
4		assist the homelessness coordinator.
5	(c)	The moneys in the special fund may also be used by the
6	departmen	nt of human services to provide grants for innovative
7	programs	that benefit homeless children or that help coordinate
8	services	for the benefit of homeless children.
9	(d)	Applications for grants shall be made to the
10	departmen	nt of human services and contain:
11	(1)	The name of the requesting organization or individual;
12	(2)	The purpose for the grant;
13	(3)	The service to be supported by the grant;
14	(4)	The target group to be benefited;
15	(5)	The cost of the grant; and
16	(6)	That the grant shall be used for activities that are
17		consistent with the purposes of this Act.
18	(e)	Grants shall only be awarded if:
19	(1)	The applicant has applied for or received all
20		applicable licenses and permits, when such is required
21		to conduct the activities or provide the services for
22		which a grant is awarded.

1	(2)	The applicant agrees to comply with applicable
2		federal, state, and county laws;
3	(3)	The grant shall not be used for purposes of
4		entertainment or perquisites; and

- (4) The applicant shall indemnify and hold harmless the department of human services, the State, its officers, agents, and employees from and against any and all claims arising out of or resulting from activities carried out or projects undertaken with funds provided hereunder, and procure sufficient insurance to provide this indemnification if requested to do so by the department of human services.
  - (f) To receive a grant, an applicant shall:
- 14 (1) Agree to make available to the department of human

  15 services all records the applicant may have relating

  16 to the operation of the applicant's activity,

  17 business, or enterprise, to allow the department of

  18 human services to monitor the applicant's compliance

  19 with the purpose of this Act; and
  - (2) Establish, to the satisfaction of the department of human services, that sufficient funds are available for the effective operation of the activity, business,

1		or enterprise for the purpose for which the grant is			
2		awarded.			
3	(g)	Every grant shall be:			
4	(1)	Monitored by the department of human services to			
5		ensure compliance with this Act and the purposes and			
6		intent of the grant; and			
7	(2)	Evaluated annually to determine whether the grant			
8		attained the intended results in the manner			
9		contemplated.			
10	(h)	Grants made by the department of human services under			
11	this Act	may be made without regard to chapters 103D and 103F,			
12	Hawaii Re	vised Statutes.			
13	SECT	ION 4. There is appropriated out of the general			
14	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ for			
15	fiscal ye	ar 2007-2008 and the same sum for fiscal year 2008-2009			
16	to be deposited into the kokua na keiki special fund.				
17	SECT	ION 5. There is appropriated out of the kokua na keiki			
18	special f	und the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be			
19	necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the same sum or so much				
20	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the				
21	purposes described in section 3.				

- 1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 2 of human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020, and
- 4 shall be repealed on June 30, 2011; provided that sections 5 and
- 5 6 shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

## Report Title:

Homelessness; Children

## Description:

Establishes a task force to coordinate resources for homeless children; sunsets on June 30, 2011. Establishes and appropriates funds to the Kokua Na Keiki special fund. Creates an administrative grant program for the department of human services to award grants for programs that benefit homeless children. (SD1)
