A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. In 2001, the twenty-first legislature of the 1 2 State of Hawaii transferred the responsibility for the licensing of teachers from the department of education to the Hawaii 3 teacher standards board. This was based on the recommendations 4 made by the Hawaii Policy Group of the National Commission on 5 6 Teaching and America's Future, a national organization with twenty-three partner states, including Hawaii. By authorizing 7 8 the Hawaii teacher standards board to assume responsibility for 9 teacher licensing, the legislature sought to strengthen the teaching profession by making it self-governing and accountable 10 11 for who becomes and remains licensed to teach in Hawaii. Like 12 other professional counterparts, such as the board of medical 13 examiners for doctors and the Hawaii State Bar Association for 14 lawyers, the Hawaii teacher standards board is authorized to 15 issue, renew, revoke, suspend, and reinstate licenses for 16 individuals desiring to pursue the licensed profession in our 17 State.

- 1 Over the past four years, the Hawaii teacher standards
- 2 board has carried out its licensing responsibilities as
- 3 described by law and, in doing so, has learned that its
- 4 statutory powers and duties now seem to require clarification.
- 5 Specifically, the power to suspend its rules needs to be further
- 6 clarified. Adding statutory language to this effect will help
- 7 to expedite the Hawaii teacher standards board's ability to
- 8 perform its duties.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 10 (1) Authorize the Hawaii teacher standards board to
- 11 suspend its rules on a case by case basis when
- 12 extenuating circumstances require it to do so; and
- 13 (2) Enable the Hawaii teacher standards board to amend
- 14 certain fees and set or amend other charges related to
- 15 the performance of its duties;
- 16 provided that these actions shall be in accordance with chapter
- 17 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 18 SECTION 2. Section 302A-803, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 "\$302A-803 Powers and duties of the board. (a) In
- 21 addition to establishing standards for the issuance and renewal



1	of licens	es and any other powers and duties authorized by law,
2	the board	's powers shall also include:
3	(1)	Setting and administering its own budget;
4	(2)	Adopting, amending, or repealing[, or suspending the
5		policies, standards, or] the rules of the board in
6		accordance with chapter 91;
7	(3)	Receiving grants or donations from private
8		foundations, and state and federal funds;
9	(4)	Submitting an annual report to the governor and the
10		legislature on the board's operations and from the
11		2007-2008 school year, submitting a summary report
12		every five years of the board's accomplishment of
13		objectives, efforts to improve or maintain teacher
14		quality, and efforts to keep its operations responsive
15		and efficient;
16	(5)	Conducting a cyclical review of standards and
17		suggesting revisions for their improvement;
18	(6)	Establishing licensing fees in accordance with chapter
19		91, including the collection of fees by means of
20		mandatory payroll deductions, which shall subsequently
21		he denosited into the state treasury and credited to

the Hawaii teacher standards board special fund;

1	(7)	Establishing penalties in accordance with chapter 91;
2	(8)	Issuing, renewing, revoking, suspending, and
3		reinstating licenses;
4	(9)	Reviewing reports from the department on individuals
5		hired on an emergency basis;
6	(10)	Applying licensing standards on a case-by-case basis
7		and conducting licensing evaluations;
8	(11)	Preparing and disseminating teacher licensing
9		information to schools and operational personnel;
10	(12)	Approving teacher preparation programs;
11	(13)	Administering reciprocity agreements with other states
12		relative to licensing;
13	(14)	Conducting research and development on teacher
14		licensure systems, beginning teacher programs, the
15		assessment of teaching skills, and other related
16		topics;
17	(15)	Participating in efforts relating to teacher quality
18		issues, conducting professional development related to
19		the board's standards, and promotion of high teacher
20		standards and accomplished teaching; and
21	(16)	Adopting applicable rules and procedures.

1 (b) If, in accordance with chapter 92, the board 2 determines, on a case by case basis, that extenuating 3 circumstances exist to justify the suspension, the board may 4 temporarily suspend its rules, or any portion thereof. The 5 board shall establish, in accordance with chapter 91, procedures for the suspension of its rules. When determining whether to 6 7 suspend its rules, the board shall also establish the length of time for which the suspension shall be in effect. 8 9 (c) The board, in accordance with chapter 92, may also amend licensing-related fees and set or amend other charges 10 11 related to the performance of its duties." 12 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007; provided that on July 1, 2009, section 2 of this Act shall be 15 16 repealed and section 302A-803, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be

reenacted in the form in which it read on June 30, 2007.
