A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING APPROPRIATIONS RELATING TO NATURAL DISASTERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds 1 2 to: Cover the costs of recovery and remediation efforts as (1)3 a result of storms that occurred in February and March 2006; 5 (2) Stabilize and repair storm-damaged slopes, drainage ways, and drainage systems to restore functionality 7 and prevent future damage; 8 Hire consultants to: (3) Determine the structural integrity of dams and (A) 10 reservoirs statewide; 11 (B) Assess potential immediate risks; 12 Recommend long-term plans to ensure dam safety; (C) 13 Investigate and review legal issues related to (D) 14 dam and reservoir failures, issues relating to 15 the safety of dam and reservoir failures, and 16 issues relating to the safety of existing dams 17 and reservoirs; and 18

Investigate and litigate, civilly and criminally, (E) 1 all issues relating to the Ka Loko dam breach 2 that occurred in March 2006. 3 The legislature finds and declares that the appropriations 5 made by this Act are in the public interest and for the public health, safety, and general welfare of the State. SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,000,000, or so 8 much thereof as may be necessary, for fiscal year 2007-2008 for 9 overtime, travel, and other staff expenses, for litigation 10 expenses, and to hire attorneys, consultants, and experts with 11 regard to matters and issues relating to the Ka Loko dam breach 12 of March 2006. 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 14 the attorney general for the purposes of this Act. 15 There is appropriated out of the general SECTION 3. 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000, or so much 17 thereof, as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 for staff 18 expenses and to hire consultants to conduct surveys, studies, 19 investigations, post flood report, and assessments of Kaloko dam 20 to determine its current physical integrity. Assessments shall 21 22 include recommendations for future structural needs and

efforts will safeguard Hawaii's residents from natural disasters of this sort in the future.
