A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 286-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[4] \$286-16[4] Powers and duties. The director of
- 4 transportation shall prescribe uniform standards and procedures
- for motor vehicle [inspection_r] equipment, driver licensing[_r]
- 6 and registration, including the form and content of records to
- 7 be maintained for the registration of vehicles and for the
- 8 licensing of drivers."
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 286-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 "§286-21 Vehicles without required equipment or in unsafe
- 12 condition.
- (a) No person shall drive or cause to move on any highway
- 14 any motor vehicle, trailer, semi trailer, or pole trailer, or
- 15 any combination thereof, [unless] if it is in unsafe condition
- 16 or if the equipment thereon is not in good working order and
- 17 adjustment, as [required in this part] prescribed by the



- 1 director of transportation, so as not to endanger the driver or
- 2 other occupant or any person upon the highway.
- 3 (b) Any vehicle that has been involved in an accident may
- 4 be deemed to be in unsafe condition if it is determined by a
- 5 police officer or an insurer that the vehicle's equipment has
- 6 been damaged so as to render the vehicle unsafe.
- 7 (c) This section may be enforced by any county by ordinance
- 8 or rules adopted in accordance with chapter 91."
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 286-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 "§286-22 Inspection by officers of the police department.
- 12 (a) The chief of police or any police officer of any county
- 13 [may], at any time when the chief of police or police officer
- 14 has reasonable cause to believe that a vehicle is unsafe or not
- 15 appropriately equipped as [required by law] prescribed by the
- 16 director of transportation, may require the owner or driver of
- 17 the vehicle to submit the vehicle to an inspection or make the
- 18 necessary corrections or repairs.
- 19 (b) If the vehicle is found to be in an unsafe condition or
- 20 if any required part or equipment is not present or if any
- 21 required part or equipment is present but not in proper repair,
- 22 the officer [shall] may issue a citation to the owner or driver



- 1 stating the reasons that the vehicle is deemed unsafe and
- 2 [shall] may require that [a new certificate of inspection as
- 3 provided in section 286 26 be obtained within five days or that]
- 4 the defect be cured.
- 5 (c) If upon inspection, the chief of police or any police
- 6 officer determines that any vehicle is in such unsafe condition
- 7 as to constitute a menace to the public and cannot reasonably be
- 8 restored to a safe condition [as required in this part], then
- 9 the chief of police or police officer [shall remove the sticker
- 10 which signifies the certificate of inspection and may inform
- 11 the director of finance who [shall] may forthwith suspend the
- 12 registration of the vehicle and give notice of the suspension to
- 13 its owner. Whenever the director of finance has suspended the
- 14 registration of any vehicle under this part, the owner of the
- 15 vehicle [shall] may be required to immediately surrender and
- 16 forward to the director of finance the certificate of
- 17 registration and the license plates last issued upon
- 18 registration of the vehicle for the current year.
- 19 (d) Any person aggrieved by this section shall have the
- 20 right to a hearing before a district judge of the circuit in
- 21 which the person is cited within five days. The judge shall
- 22 determine whether the chief of police or any police officer



- 1 reasonably performed the chief of police's or police officer's
- 2 duties [hereunder] under this section and shall make any
- 3 appropriate order."
- 4 SECTION 4. Section 286-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 "§286-23 Responsibility for compliance.
- 7 (a) Every owner or driver, upon receiving a citation as
- 8 provided in section 286-22(b), shall comply [therewith] with the
- 9 citation and shall within five days [secure an official
- 10 certificate of inspection or make the necessary corrections or
- 11 repairs, or the driver may request a hearing as provided in
- 12 section 286-22(d).
- (b) No person shall operate any vehicle after receiving a
- 14 citation [with reference thereto] as provided in section 286-
- 15 22(b), except that if the driver is authorized to do so by the
- 16 police officer, the driver may return the vehicle to the
- 17 driver's residence or place of business or the residence or
- 18 place of business of the owner of the vehicle, or to an
- 19 automotive repair shop, if within a distance of twenty miles,
- 20 until [a certificate of inspection is obtained or] the necessary
- 21 corrections or repairs are made."

1	SECTION 5. Section 286-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended to read as follows:		
3	"§286-24 Registered owner's responsibility; registration		
4	plates as prima facie evidence as to the fault of the registered		
5	owner. In any proceeding for \underline{a} violation of this part, the		
6	registered owner of a vehicle shall be deemed to be responsible		
7	for the unsafe condition of the vehicle."		
8	SECTION 6. Section 291-21.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
9	amended to read as follows:		
10	"§291-21.5 Regulation of motor vehicle sun screening		
11	devices; penalty.		
12	(a) No person shall operate, permit the operation of, cause		
13	to be operated, or park any motor vehicle on a public highway if		
14	the glazing material of the motor vehicle:		
15	(1) Does not meet the requirements of the Federal Motor		
16	Vehicle Safety Standards 205 in effect at the time		
17	of its manufacture; or		
18	(2) Is used in conjunction with sun screening devices		
19	not exempted [from this section] by subsection (d)		
20	[hereof].		
21	(b) No person shall install, mount, adhere, affix, or use		
22	any sun screening device or combination of devices in		

1	conjunction with the glazing material of a motor vehicle [which]				
2	that does not meet the requirements of the Federal Motor Vehicle				
3	Safety Standards 205 in effect at the time of the glazing				
4	material's manufacture except as provided in this section. Any				
5	person who violates this section shall be liable for the removal				
6	of any sun screening device applied contrary to this section.				
7	(c) A safety inspection required under section 286 25 shall				
8	include a test to ensure that the glazing material and any sun				
9	screening devices meet the requirements specified in this				
10	section.				
11	(d) (c) This section shall not apply to:				
12	(1) Rearview mirrors;				
13	(2) Adjustable nontransparent sun visors [which] that				
14	are mounted forward of the side windows and are not				
15	attached to the glazing material;				
16	(3) Signs, stickers, or other materials [which] that are				
17	displayed in a seven-inch square in the lower				
18	corner of the windshield farthest removed from the				
19	driver or signs, stickers, or other materials				
20	[which] that are displayed in a five-inch square in				
21	the lower corner of the windshield nearest the				
22	driver;				

1	(4)	Rear trunk lid handle or hinges;
2	(5)	Window wipers and window wiper motors;
3	(6)	Transparent sun screening film materials [which]
4		that are installed, affixed, or applied along the
5		top edge of the windshield so long as such
6		materials do not encroach upon the AS-1 portion of
7		the windshield as provided by the Federal Motor
8		Vehicle Safety Standards 205 or no lower than four
9		inches below the top of the windshield, when
10		measured from the middle point of the bottom edge
11		of the top windshield moulding if no AS-1 markings
12		can be found in the left or right upper margin of
13		the windshield;
14	(7)	Sun screening devices for front side wing vents
15		and windows [which,] that, when used in conjunction
16		with the glazing material, have a light
17		transmittance of no less than thirty-five per cent
18		plus or minus six per cent;
19	(8)	Sun screening devices for side windows necessary
20		for driving visibility [which] that are to the rear
21		of the driver and for rear windows necessary for
22		driving visibility [which,] that, when used in

1	conjunction with the glazing material, have a light
2	transmittance of no less than thirty-five per cent
3	plus or minus six per cent;
4	(9) Side windows [which] that are to the rear of the
5	driver and rear windows on vans, minivans, trucks,
6	or buses[; provided that], if the vehicles are
7	equipped with rearview mirrors on both sides; and
8	(10) Privacy drapes, curtains, or blinds, or any
9	combination, installed on the interior of motor
10	homes.
11	[(e)] <u>(d)</u> Any person who violates this section shall be fined
12	not less than \$50 nor more than \$250 for each separate offense."
13	SECTION 7. Chapter 286 Part II, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	repealed.
15	SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
