A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the recent changes
to the federal temporary assistance for needy families program
rules and subsequent first-to-work program changes, which limit
educational activities to two years of study leading to
vocational or technical degrees in order to meet federal work
requirements, grandfathers currently participating students and

7 allows them to finish their education. For example, first-to-

 ${f 8}$ work participating students who are pursuing a baccalaureate

degree are transferred to the state-funded bridge-to-hope

program to continue their studies.

11 However, new federal temporary assistance for needy

families program first-to-work participating students are

restricted to the new two-year education activity option to

14 receive vocational or technical degrees. In other words, these

15 students may not continue to pursue a four-year baccalaureate

16 degree, and favorite areas of study such as pre-nursing will no

17 longer be available to them, without violating federal work

1 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for the 2 bridge to hope program to enable new federal temporary 3 assistance for needy families and new temporary assistance to 4 other needy families participants to pursue educational 5 activities beyond the new two-year federal limit by transferring 6 them to the state-funded bridge to hope program. 7 SECTION 2. Section 346-68, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 9 "(a) There is created within the department a post-10 secondary education benefits program, to be known as the bridge 11 to hope program, for heads of households in the temporary assistance to needy families program[-], temporary assistance to 12 other needy families, and first-to-work programs. 13 14 (b) To receive assistance under this program, the [single] 15 parent shall: 16 (1) Be enrolled as a student each term[+] in an approved course of study such as vocational education; 17 Maintain passing grades or better throughout the 18 (2) 19 course of study; and 20 (3) Meet work activity requirements as defined by the 21 department [-]; provided that the work requirements

shall be consistent with academic success."

- 1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so
