A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REMOTE DISPENSING PHARMACIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many individuals
- 2 living in underserved or remote areas need improved access to
- 3 medications and pharmacy services. A remote dispensing program
- 4 that allows for the dispensing of low-cost medications through
- 5 the use of a secure remote dispensing machine and patient
- 6 counseling via a two-way interactive videoconferencing system
- 7 will help to resolve the dual problem of access to prescription
- 8 drugs and pharmacists for low-income populations and remote
- 9 areas.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to permit the operation of
- 11 remote dispensing pharmacies.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 461-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- amended by adding five new definitions to be appropriately
- 14 inserted and to read as follows:
- ""Remote dispensing" means the practice of dispensing drugs
- 16 through the use of trained personnel, telecommunications, and

1	informati	on technologies to patients at a remote dispensing		
2	pharmacy.			
3	"Rem	ote dispensing machine" means a device used for		
4	dispensin	g unit-of-use drugs that is operated using information		
5	technolog	ies and is located in a remote dispensing pharmacy.		
6	Drugs dispensed from the remote dispensing machine shall be			
7	dispensed	as packaged, with no changes to the drug, its		
8	strength, or its unit quantity, except for the addition of wate			
9	for recon	stitution of dry powder drugs. The remote dispensing		
10	machine shall have the following features to ensure that it is			
11	appropriately secure at all times and that all transactions are			
12	properly	documented:		
13	(1)	Secure double-locked cabinets;		
14	(2)	Bar-coding or similar technology that effectively		
15		recognizes the product;		
16	(3)	A cabinet that delivers only one bar-coded unit-of-use		
17		container per dispense, per prescription;		
18	(4)	A scanner and printer that, upon releasing the unit-		
19		of-use container from the remote dispensing machine,		
20		the container is scanned to confirm that it is in fact		

the correct container, and with such confirmation, the

1	printer will print a patient-specific label that also
2	has a barcode that is scanned to confirm that it is
3	the correct label for the prescription; and
4	(5) A video component that allows the patient to have a
5	"face-to-face" consultation with the pharmacist at the
6	responsible pharmacy.
7	"Remote dispensing pharmacy" means the area in an
8	institutional facility located in this State that is used
9	exclusively for the storage and dispensing of pharmacy-dispensed
10	prescription drugs through the use of a remote dispensing
11	machine. Each remote dispensing machine shall operate with only
12	one responsible pharmacy. The responsible pharmacy may operate
13	with more than one remote dispensing machine. The following
14	must be conspicuously displayed at the remote dispensing
15	machine:
16	(1) Copy of the license of the responsible pharmacy; and
17	(2) Copy of the license of the pharmacist-in-charge of the
18	responsible pharmacy.
19	"Remote dispensing technician" means an individual who
20	assists the pharmacist in various activities specific to the
21	remote dispensing pharmacy, including the technical services of

- preparing pharmaceuticals for final dispensing while under

 under
- 5 valid permit issued by the board pursuant to section 461-14.
- 6 All responsible pharmacies shall maintain, on-site at the remote
- 7 dispensing pharmacy and have available for inspection at all
- 8 times, records and documentation of the following:
- 9 (1) All prescriptions dispensed at the remote dispensing pharmacy;
- 11 (2) All inventory movement at the remote dispensing pharmacy; and
- (3) A policies and procedures manual of the remotedispensing pharmacy."
- 15 SECTION 3. Chapter 461, Hawaii Revised Statues, is amended
- 16 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 17 read as follows:
- 18 "<u>\$461-</u> Remote dispensing pharmacy; operations. (a) The
- 19 remote dispensing pharmacy shall be connected via live computer
- 20 link, video link, and audio link to the responsible pharmacy.



1	(b) The remote dispensing pharmacy shall be under the
2	direct supervision of the registered pharmacist in charge of the
3	responsible pharmacy. The pharmacist in charge shall ensure
4	that the remote dispensing pharmacy is in compliance with all
5	laws and rules governing the practice of pharmacy. The
6	pharmacist in charge shall ensure that the remote dispensing
7	pharmacy is appropriately staffed by a qualified remote
8	dispensing technician.
9	(c) The remote dispensing pharmacy shall be effectively
10	secured to prevent unauthorized access at all times. There
11	shall be visual oversight and continuous surveillance of the
12	remote dispensing pharmacy by a pharmacist in the responsible
13	pharmacy while the remote dispensing pharmacy is in operation.
14	(d) The remote dispensing pharmacy shall have a
15	confidential area available for communication between the
16	patient and the pharmacist at the responsible pharmacy.
17	(e) There shall be visual oversight of the final
18	dispensing activity from the remote dispensing machine and
19	remote dispensing pharmacy to the patient.

1	(f) Drugs shall not be dispensed from the remote
2	dispensing machine and the remote dispensing pharmacy when the
3	responsible pharmacy is closed.
4	(g) The remote dispensing pharmacy shall use the
5	information technology system of the responsible pharmacy.
6	(h) Prescription labels for the product from the remote
7	dispensing machine must be generated at the remote dispensing
8	pharmacy.
9	(i) All prescriptions distributed at the remote dispensing
10	pharmacy must have a label that meets the requirements set forth
11	in section 328-16 affixed to the final drug container. The
12	label shall list the address of the remote dispensing pharmacy.
13	(j) Prescription records filled at the remote dispensing
14	pharmacy shall be maintained at the responsible pharmacy and
15	shall be distinguishable from those records filled at the
16	responsible pharmacy.
17	(k) A pharmacist at the responsible pharmacy shall approve

each prescription before it is dispensed to the patient.

1	(1)	An offer to counsel the patient by a pharmacist shall
2	be made b	y the remote dispensing technician for all
3	prescript	ions.
4	<u>(m)</u>	Controlled substances shall not be dispensed from any
5	remote di	spensing machine or remote dispensing pharmacy.
6	<u>(n)</u>	The pharmacist in charge of the remote dispensing
7	machine s	hall ensure that:
8	(1)	Written policies and procedures are developed, prior
9		to utilizing the machine, that ensures the safe and
10		effective dispensing of pharmaceutical products;
11	(2)	No prescription drug is dispensed at the remote
12		dispensing pharmacy until a pharmacist at the
13		responsible pharmacy has verified the finished
14		prescription drug using the live computer link, video
15		link, and audio link;
16	(3)	Only one prescription is dispensed and labeled from
17		the remote dispensing machine at a time;
18	(4)	The patient is present when the drug is dispensed from
19		the remote dispensing machine;

1	(5)	The remote dispensing machine and the remote
2		dispensing pharmacy are operating safely, accurately,
3		and securely;
4	(6)	Access to the remote dispensing machine and to
5		medications contained within or associated with the
6		machine, including policies that assign, discontinue,
7		or change access to the remote dispensing machine and
8		medications, is defined;
9	<u>(7)</u>	A pharmacist licensed in this State, employed by the
10		responsible pharmacy, has secured access to the drugs
11		in the remote dispensing machine;
12	(8)	Access to the medications complies with state and
13		federal laws, rules, and regulations;
14	(9)	If a patient refuses the prescription drug at the time
15		it is dispensed, the prescription drug is locked in a
16		secured cabinet and accessible only by a pharmacist of
17		the responsible pharmacy;
18	(10)	There is proper inventory control at the remote
19		dispensing pharmacy and only a registered pharmacist
20		of the responsible pharmacy shall stock the remote
21		dispensing machine;

1	(11)	A reconciliation of the physical inventory of the	
2		remote dispensing pharmacy is conducted at least	
3		annually;	
4	(12)	All personnel who operate the remote dispensing	
5		machine at the remote dispensing pharmacy are properly	
6		trained. Training shall ensure the competence and	
7		ability of all personnel who operate any component of	
8		the remote dispensing machine and the remote	
9		dispensing pharmacy. Documentation of training shall	
10		be kept by the responsible pharmacy;	
11	(13)	The remote dispensing machine is stocked accurately	
12		and in accordance with established written policies	
13		and procedures. The pharmacist shall check the	
14		accuracy of the product supplied for stocking the	
15		remote dispensing machine; and	
16	(14)	Entry to the remote dispensing pharmacy is limited to	
17		authorized personnel only.	
18	(0)	The pharmacist of the responsible pharmacy is	
19	responsib	le for the integrity of the drugs in the remote	
20	dispensin	g machine and that drugs for machine are provided to	
21	the remote dispensing pharmacy only from the responsible		
22	pharmacy."		
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SECTION 4. Section 461-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§461-9 Pharmacist in charge; pharmacy personnel. 4 registered pharmacist shall be in personal and immediate charge 5 of the pharmacy and personnel employed in the pharmacy. 6 Temporary absences of the registered pharmacist shall be unlawful except for periods of time and under circumstances as 7 8 authorized under the rules of the board. During any absence of 9 the registered pharmacist, prescriptions may not be filled, compounded, or received by telephone and no drugs shall be sold; 10 provided that this shall not preclude the sale at those times of 11

things that might be sold were the pharmacy a store not subject

to this chapter. No person other than a registered pharmacist

or a pharmacy intern under the registered pharmacist's immediate

(b) No person shall practice as a pharmacy intern without having first obtained a permit from the board. The board shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 defining the functions of a pharmacy intern, establishing the requirements to be met by an applicant for a pharmacy intern permit, and specifying the

supervision shall fill or compound prescriptions except as

provided by subsection (c).

- 1 duration of the permit and the procedures for the immediate
- 2 supervision of the pharmacy intern by a registered pharmacist.
- 3 (c) A pharmacy technician or remote dispensing technician
- 4 may be employed to assist the registered pharmacist under rules
- 5 adopted by the board pursuant to chapter 91 that define the
- 6 qualifications and functions of the pharmacy technician or the
- 7 remote dispensing technician and provide the procedures for
- 8 control and supervision by a registered pharmacist.
- 9 (d) A remote dispensing technician shall be directly
- 10 responsible to the responsible pharmacy and shall be under
- 11 continuous supervision at the remote dispensing pharmacy by a
- 12 registered pharmacist at the responsible pharmacy."
- 13 SECTION 5. Section 461-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- "§461-14 Permits for operation of pharmacy[-];
- 16 notifications for operation of remote dispensing pharmacy. (a
- 17 It shall be unlawful for any person to operate, maintain, open,
- 18 change location, or establish any pharmacy or remote dispensing
- 19 pharmacy within the State without first having obtained a permit
- 20 or prior notification from the board.
- 21 (b) [Application] Applications for permits and
- 22 notifications shall be made on a form to be prescribed by the



1	board.	Separate	[application]	applications	shall	be	made	and

- 2 separate permits and notifications shall be issued for each
- 3 separate [place at which is carried on any of the] location
- 4 where operations [for which] require a permit [is required]
- 5 pursuant to this section.
- 6 (c) On evidence satisfactory to the board, a permit or
- 7 notification shall be issued, provided:
- 8 (1) That the pharmacy for which the permit or notification
- 9 is sought is or will be, in full compliance with this
- 10 chapter and rules of the board;
- 11 (2) That the location [and appointments] of the pharmacy
- 12 [are] is such that it can be operated and maintained
- 13 without endangering the public health or safety; and
- 14 (3) That the pharmacy will be under the personal and
- immediate supervision of a registered pharmacist.
- 16 (d) [No application] Application for a permit shall be
- 17 refused [except pursuant to] for noncompliance of this section
- 18 [and] only after notice to the applicant [and] with a full and
- 19 fair hearing.
- 20 (e) To operate a remote dispensing pharmacy, the following
- 21 information shall be submitted to the board:
- 22 (1) A form prescribed by the board;

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1	(2)	The name, address, and permit number of the
2		responsible pharmacy;
3	(3)	The name and license number of the pharmacist in
4		charge;
5	(4)	The name and address of the institutional facility
6		where the remote dispensing pharmacy is located;
7	(5)	The floor plan of the remote dispensing pharmacy,
8		including a diagram of the space or location of the
9		remote dispensing machine;
10	(6)	The date the remote dispensing pharmacy will be ready
11		for operation;
12	<u>(7)</u>	A description of the security system;
13	(8)	A description of the computer, video, and audio link;
14		and
15	(9)	Photographs of the remote dispensing pharmacy area,
16		including the remote dispensing machine, the security
17		system, computer, counseling area, and locked cabinet.
18	Fail	are to comply with this section shall be considered a
19	violation	of this chapter and shall result in disciplinary
20	action aga	ainst the pharmacist in charge and the responsible
21	pharmacy.	

1 Permits, notifications, and licenses issued under this (f) 2 section and section 461-15 may be closed upon written request 3 from the permit holder or licensee. The board shall approve all 4 requests for closure of a permit or license. Once approved, the holder of the closed permit or license shall re-apply as a new 5 applicant in order to conduct business where a permit or license 6 7 is required." 8 SECTION 6. Section 461-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 amended by amending the title and subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 10 "§461-16 Fees for permits, notifications, and licenses; 11 renewal. (a) The board shall collect application, license, 12 notification, and permit fees for each permit to operate a 13 pharmacy or for each license to operate as a wholesale 14 prescription drug distributor and a fee for the issuance of a 15 16 permit in accordance with section 461-15(a)(1), (5), (6) and 17 (7).Permits and notifications issued under sections 461-14 18 and 461-15 and licenses issued under section 461-8.6 shall be 19 20 conspicuously displayed in the place for which the permit or

license was granted. The permits and licenses shall not be

transferable, shall expire on December 31 of each odd-numbered

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- 1 year following the date of issuance, and shall be renewed
- 2 biennially."
- 3 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so
- 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and
- 6 the same sum as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009, to
- 7 carry out the purposes of this Act.
- 8 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 9 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon approval.
