A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AT-RISK PERSONS ON HAWAII ISLAND.

RE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII-

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| 1 | SECTION 1. The legislature finds that conservation corps, |
| 2 | such as Americorps and the department of land and natural |
| 3 | resources' youth conservation corps, place participants in |
| 4 | natural resource conservation activities to help them develop a |
| 5 | sense of stewardship and build valuable work experience through |
| 6 | community service, training, and education. However, these |
| 7 | programs are mainly offered as summer activities for students. |
| 8 | A similar program for other segments of the population would |
| 9 | greatly benefit at-risk groups who need assistance in developing |
| 10 | life and job skills that will enable them to become responsible, |
| 11 | self-reliant citizens and would thereby benefit the entire |

- 16 services to establish and operate a Hawaii conservation corps

Conservation Corps; At-Risk Persons

Description:

Requires the department of human services, in collaboration with the department of land and natural resources and the department of education, to establish and implement a conservation corps program to help at-risk persons on Hawaii island develop life and job skills and gain work experience; appropriates or authorizes temporary assistance for needy families funds. (SD1)
