SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO IMPLEMENT XERISCAPING TO DECORATE ROADWAYS, MEDIAL STRIPS, ROUNDABOUTS AND OTHER AREAS UNDER ITS JURISDICTION.

1	WHEREAS, water is our most precious natural resource and
2 3	cannot be considered limitless; and
5 4 5 6	WHEREAS, the conservation of water is necessary not just in times of drought, but in anticipation of Hawaii's future population growth; and

8 9 10	WHEREAS, the variety of vegetation found in Hawaii reflects the islands' wide range of microclimates from tropical forest to deserts; and
11	WUEDEAC, the goal of vericesping is to encote a wigually
12 13 14	WHEREAS, the goal of xeriscaping is to create a visually attractive landscape by using drought-tolerant plants and grasses in combination with irrigation techniques; and
15 16	WHEREAS, xeriscaping is not to be confused with zero-
17 18	scaping which uses mainly plants found in the desert such as juniper, cactus, or yucca; and
19	
20 21 22	WHEREAS, xeriscaping is considered more aesthetically pleasing; and
23 24 25	WHEREAS, native Hawaiian flora such a Piligrass (heteropogon contortus), Sandalwood (santaum freycinetianum), and Dwarf Naupaka (scaevola coriacea) can be utilized for
26 27 28	xeriscaping; and WHEREAS, a properly maintained xeriscape can easily use
29 30 21	less than one-half the water of a traditional landscape; and
31 32	WHEREAS, a xeriscaped area not only reduces the amount of water used compared to traditional landscapes, but also reduces

the amount of maintenance needed for watering, fertilizing, 1 2 mowing, trimming, and pruning; and 3 4 WHEREAS, planted areas established by the Department of 5 Transportation have failed to receive regular maintenance and after a few years become unsightly; 6 7 8 WHEREAS, xeriscaping is ideally suited for the needs of the Department of Transportation and would provide aesthetic, 9 economic, and environmental benefits for the Department and the 10 State; now, therefore, 11 -12 13 BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, the 14 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 15 Transportation is urged to implement xeriscaping to decorate 16 roadways, medial strips, and roundabouts, and other areas under 17 18 its jurisdiction; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 21 Transportation is also urged to use suitable indigenous vegetation in future xeriscaping projects; and 22 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and the 25 Director of Transportation. 26 27 28 OFFERED BY: Nimon Sokom / 29
