## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TO CHARGE RESIDENT TUITION TO PACIFIC ISLAND STUDENTS.

WHEREAS, the Board of Regents of the University of Hawaii 1 last year eliminated the non-resident tuition waiver for Pacific 2 Island students who are from Pacific island jurisdictions that 3 have historical ties to the United States and have degree 4 granting public higher educational institutions; and 5 6

WHEREAS, students from these Pacific Islands must now pay 7 non-resident tuition rates governed by the Western Undergraduate 8 Exchange, which equates to one hundred fifty per cent of the 9 resident tuition-rate; and 10

WHEREAS, the Western Undergraduate Exchange tuition rate 12 was apparently intended to apply to American students from 13 states that lie to the west of the Mississippi River; and 14

WHEREAS, in contrast, the Board of Regents continues to 16 grant non-resident tuition waivers to Pacific Island students 17 who are from island jurisdictions that have historical ties to 18 the United States but lack degree granting public higher 19 educational institutions; and 20

WHEREAS, the Pacific Island students who are excluded from 22 receiving the non-resident tuition waiver comprise a very minute 23 portion of the total tuition revenues of the University of 24 25 Hawaii; and

WHEREAS, the tuition increase for this small group of 27 students has a disproportionately larger financial impact on 28 them as compared to students because the minimum wages of, and 29 the median household income of families in, those islands fall 30 far below the minimum wage and median household income of 31 32 families of their American counterparts in states that are a

part of the Western Undergraduate Exchange as compared to 1 students; and 2 3 WHEREAS, a scheduled system-wide increase in tuition 4 coupled with the elimination of the tuition waivers have forced 5 some Pacific Island students to apply for student loans; and 6 7 WHEREAS, hopes for financial assistance through a Pacific 8 Island scholarship program have not materialized; now, 9 therefore. 10 11 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 12 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, the 13 House of Representatives concurring, that the Board of Regents 14 of the University of Hawaii is respectfully requested to 15 reinstitute non-resident tuition waivers for students from 16 Pacific island jurisdictions that have historical ties to the 17 United States and have degree granting public higher educational 18 institutions; and 19 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Regents is requested to submit a report on this matter to the Legislature 22 23 not later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2008; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 26 27 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chair of the Board 28 of Regents of the University of Hawaii and the President of the 29 University of Hawaii. 30 OFFERED BY: (Mile Ha 31 32 cerun Qaluand SCR LRB 07-2577.doc
