## SENATE RESOLUTION

---

ENCOURAGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO DEVELOP A SKIN CANCER EDUCATION AND PREVENTION PROGRAM AND COLLECT DATA ON THE INCIDENCE OF ALL FORMS OF SKIN CANCER AMONG RESIDENTS AND TO WORK WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO IMPLEMENT A CANCER AWARENESS PROGRAM IN ALL PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

1           WHEREAS, skin cancer is the most common form of cancer in  
2 the United States, with more than one million new cases  
3 diagnosed annually; and

4  
5           WHEREAS, one in five Americans will develop some form of  
6 skin cancer during the course of their lifetime; and

7  
8           WHEREAS, more than ninety per cent of all cases of skin  
9 cancer develop from exposure to the sunlight; and

10  
11           WHEREAS, a person's risk for developing skin cancer doubles  
12 if the person has had five or more sunburns; therefore,  
13 sunbathers and people that spend a great deal of time outdoors  
14 are at particular risk of skin cancer; and

15  
16           WHEREAS, skin cancer from sun exposure is largely  
17 preventable through the use of barriers that protect the user  
18 from the sun's harmful rays, such as sunscreen, hats, and  
19 clothing; and

20  
21           WHEREAS, residents and visitors to Hawaii are exposed to  
22 high doses of ultraviolet radiation from the sun daily; and

23  
24           WHEREAS, people with special skin conditions may be even  
25 more susceptible to the skin damage from ultraviolet radiation  
26 from sunlight; and

27  
28           WHEREAS, residents and visitors to the State need to be  
29 made aware of the risk of sun cancer due to prolonged repeated  
30 exposure to high doses of ultraviolet radiation from the sun;

1           WHEREAS, Hawaii's young people need to be educated on the  
2 dangers of sun exposure and the ways that they may protect  
3 themselves against skin cancer; and

5           WHEREAS, under Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, the  
6 Department of Education is required to assume responsibility for  
7 school health services; now therefore,  
8

9           BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth  
10 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007,  
11 that the Department of Health is encouraged to develop a  
12 program, that includes public service announcements, to educate  
13 all residents and visitors on the dangers of skin cancer and the  
14 importance of sun protection; and

16           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is  
17 strongly urged to work with the Department of Education to  
18 develop and implement a program in all public schools to educate  
19 Hawaii's students on the dangers of sun exposure and the ways  
20 that they may protect themselves against skin cancer; and

22           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is  
23 urged to begin data collection on the incidence of all forms of  
24 skin cancer among residents of Hawaii, including melanoma, basal  
25 cell carcinoma, and squamous cell carcinoma; and

27           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is  
28 encouraged to develop a program to encourage residents to  
29 receive regular skin cancer screenings from their health care  
30 provider; and

32           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is  
33 encouraged to examine the benefits of dark automobile window  
34 tinting for persons with skin conditions that make them more  
35 sensitive to sunlight; and



1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
2 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health, Chairperson  
3 of the Board of Education, and the Superintendent of Education.
