Establishes a veterans' home account and veterans' gift account to be administered by the Hawaii health systems corporation for the state veterans' home in Hilo. Also requires accounts to comply with reporting requirements for non-general fund information.

Changes and clarifies the composition of the policy advisory board on

veterans' services.

RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF VETERANS' SERVICES. Establishes a permanent clerk typist II position in the office of veterans' services on Oahu. Appropriates \$33,230 in FY 2007-2008

and FY 2008-2009.

#### RELATING TO VETERAN BURIAL GRANTS,

Requires the office of veterans' services, at the request of a survivor or interested party of a deceased Filipino veteran who joined the New Filipino Scouts between October 6, 1945, and June 30, 1947, to make payment directly to a mortuary or crematory for funeral and burial services, and to transport the veteran's remains to the Philippines upon submission of an unpaid invoice. Establishes a 5% income tax credit for Hawaii employers that hire state residents who are members of the national guard. Establishes that the maximum tax credit per national guard/employee shall be \$1,000.

HB 1927

RELATING TO TAXATION.

Provides a State income tax exemption for persons retired or currently serving in the armed forces of the United States who are on active

military duty outside the State pursuant to military orders.
